Description of Course:

This course offers a comprehensive study of the prophetic literature of the Old Testament, focusing on both the Major Prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, and Daniel) and the Minor Prophets (Hosea through Malachi). Students will explore the historical context, cultural background, and divine messages delivered through these prophets as they spoke to Israel, Judah, and the surrounding nations.


The class will emphasize the role of the prophets as God's messengers, calling His people to repentance, covenant faithfulness, and hope in His future promises. Key theological themes such as judgment, restoration, justice, the coming Messiah, and the kingdom of God will be highlighted. Attention will also be given to the literary styles of prophetic writings, the use of symbolism and imagery, and how these messages apply to both ancient and modern contexts.
