Virtual Fencing: Advancing Grazing & Conservation

Learn how virtual fencing is helping Missouri livestock producers unlock new regenerative grazing strategies, expand livestock and cover crop integration, and enhance natural resource conservation.

Presenter: Kaitlyn Dozler, University of Missouri Center for Regenerative Agriculture

Kaitlyn will introduce the Center's Virtual Fencing Program, explain the fundamentals producers should know about this technology, and share how it's being utilized in both cover crops and perennial pasture grazing systems across Missouri. She'll also highlight real producer experiences, cost-share opportunities, and farmer-to-farmer education networks that connect producers using virtual fencing on their operations.

Farm Succession: Planning for the Next Generation
