

PRIVACY POLICY

All references to 'our', 'us', or 'we' within this policy document, and within the opt-in notice, are deemed to refer to Peter A. Papadopulo Legal Services (“our website”) and any of its respective associated companies and related businesses.

We will take all reasonable steps to protect your personal information.

This Privacy Statement is incorporated into, and is part of, the Terms and Conditions which govern your use of our website. We provide this Privacy Statement to help you to understand what we may do with the information that we obtain from you. By providing your personal details to us, you signify your acceptance of this Privacy Statement. If you do not accept this Privacy Statement, please do not provide your personal details to us.

We will use your information for the purposes set out below. You will have an opportunity to unsubscribe whenever we communicate with you. Collecting Personal Information

We make use of "cookies" to help us gather the following information from visitors to our website about you. This information is anonymous and does not identify you. A “cookie” is a small data file that servers send to your browser when you visit our website. The use of “cookies” will assist us to improve your experience when visiting

our website. You can delete these “cookies” at any time, or you can change the settings in your web browser to disable “cookies”. If you do disable “cookies” some functions on our website may not function correctly.

Use of Information

We will use personal and non-personal information collected from you in the following ways:

Internal purposes

We may use information for internal client analysis. We will use your personal information in order to communicate with you about our services. We have in place physical, electronic and managerial procedures to safeguard the information we collect from you.
