### **Detailed Narrative:**

The purpose of this visit was to provide additional comments from a previous visit (#4633DRBTZXG-4633-FV001).

### \*\*\*\*\*Occupational hygiene consultant comments.

This MLITSD Occupational Hygiene Consultant, Fatemeh Golrasan, attended the virtual meeting on September 17, 2025, with Alexandra Rondinone, MLITSD Inspector, in a supporting role, to assess concerns related to the lack of proper heat stress policies, procedures, and cooling centres across the school board.

The Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) Hot Weather Policy and Procedures were provided to the MLITSD by the workplace parties during a previous visit (##4633DRBTZXG-4633-FV001).

### **Findings and Comments:**

- 1. The employer has developed the **TCDSB Hot Weather Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) and Protocol** to raise awareness of heat stress illnesses and outline practical measures to help prevent heat-related discomfort and illness, ensuring the protection of both workers and students. The protocol is activated when a **heat warning is issued by Environment and Climate Change Canada**. According to the employer, when the protocol is activated, email notifications are sent to school principals, custodians, and all staff with specific instructions.
- 2. Once activated, the protocol includes several administrative control measures, including but not limited to the use of cooling centres by staff on a rotational basis throughout the day, reminders to drink water, turning off electronics, and staying indoors. However, no trigger temperature is used to escalate control measures in proportion to the level of heat exposure. Additionally, the employer has not specified whether, and for how long, scheduled heat-relief breaks may be implemented.

The OHCOW Humidex-Based Heat Response Plan was discussed with the workplace parties. This plan is based on workplace measurements, not weather station or media reports. The use of a thermal hygrometer is a simple way to measure temperature and relative humidity within the workplace. The employer is encouraged to adopt the OHCOW humidex-based plan to ensure timely and proportional controls.

- 3. The employer reported that some classrooms are not equipped with air conditioning units. They are currently seeking approvals for a pilot project involving the installation of ceiling fans in classrooms.
- 4. The employer reported that when workers or students experience heat-related discomfort, they may access air-conditioned cooling centres such as the library, gym, or portables. The employer is advised to ensure that adequate air-conditioned space is available for staff.
