 Communication and Stop Work Authority: Maintain clear communication with your colleagues and supervisors. If you observe an unsafe situation, stop work and inform your supervisor immediately. We encourage an environment where safety concerns are raised without fear of reprimand.

Continuous Learning: Actively participate in all mandatory safety training sessions, toolbox talks, and safety meetings. Stay updated on new safety regulations and best practices.

Stop Work Authority

C A Contractors empowers all employees to stop work if they believe a situation is unsafe. Don't hesitate to stop work and notify your supervisor if you observe any of the following:

- Unsafe work practices being performed.
- Missing or inadequate PPE.
- Faulty or damaged equipment.
- Unforeseen hazards not identified in the risk assessment.
- Unclear or conflicting instructions.

CDM 2015 Regulations

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 (CDM 2015) are a set of regulations in the UK that focus on managing health, safety, and welfare in construction projects. As a cladding and EWI systems installer, C A Contractors is obligated to comply with these regulations. Here's a breakdown of key aspects relevant to our work:
