#### EquesTraining Lesson Schedule On & Off!

These fur babies can be different from one day to the next when the weather is so changeable. They can be very frisky on a blustery cold morning and rather lazy on a sunny warm afternoon. Riders beware....

If the temperature is below 32 degrees and it is cloudy or snowing, classes will be rescheduled. If it is bright and sunny, it can feel much warmer and be comfortable for riding. So, the best idea is to *check with Star if in doubt about your class meeting* on a particular day, as conditions can change rapidly sometimes. Also, since the Ranch is in the rural Palmer Divide climate zone, it can be several degrees cooler and getting more snow than the Springs, at the same time of day or night.

This first week of March was pleasant and we have enjoyed riding lessons up until Saturday 3/5 in the afternoon.
