Strategic Highlights

In 2022 (1443-44), Afghanistan-Pakistan Women's Economic Empowerment (APWEE) responded to the earthquake in Paktika, Afghanistan and its surrounding areas and floods in Afghanistan and Pakistan by providing relief to disadvantaged women and their families.

Additionally, APWEE launched its small business, including livestock farming and greenhouse farming, and science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) scholarship programs in Afghanistan and Pakistan, respectively. Also, APWEE became a Grow with Google Partner and began offering Google Career Certificate Scholarships.

Looking Ahead

With your support, APWEE will continue to respond to the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan by providing emergency food assistance and disaster relief to disadvantaged women and their families. Additionally, we will expand our small business, job training, and STEM scholarship programs in Afghanistan and Pakistan. For example, we will train disadvantaged women in tailoring and sewing and provide them with sewing machines, fabrics, and threads to start businesses from their homes.



DISASTER RELIEF

In 2022 (1443-44), APWEE provided emergency relief, including tents, blankets, and emergency food assistance, to 100 earthquake victims, prioritizing women and children, in Paktika, Afghanistan.

Additionally, we provided emergency relief, including essential home items, blankets, mosquito nets, hygiene products, and/or clean water filters, to 695 flood victims, prioritizing disadvantaged women including widows and disabled women, in Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Pakistan and Laghman, Logar, Kunar, and Nangarhar, Afghanistan.

FOOD SECURITY

In 2022 (1443-44), APWEE provided emergency food assistance to 564 families, prioritizing disadvantaged women, facing hunger in Baghlan, Kabul, Kandahar, Kunar, Kunduz, Laghman, Logar, Nangarhar, and Wardak, Afghanistan as well as Afghan refugees in Balochistan, Pakistan.

SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS

In 2022 (1443-44), APWEE provided livestock, including chickens and cows, to 18 widows in Baghlan, Afghanistan. Additionally, APWEE setup four greenhouses for eight widows in Kabul, Afghanistan.





STEM SCHOLARSHIPS

In 2022 (1443-44), APWEE awarded 11 STEM scholarships to low-income female students in Kabul*, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, and Kunduz*.

*Regrettably, six of these scholarship recipients' education was stopped; APWEE is exploring other ways to support them and other disadvantaged women in Afghanistan such as remote learning opportunities, micro credentialing, and tailoring and sewing workshops.

WINTER SURVIVAL

In 2022 (1443-44), APWEE provided winter survival kits, including blankets and charcoal, to dozens of families, prioritizing disadvantaged women, facing freezing temperatures in Kabul, Afghanistan.
