TO OUR SUPPORTERS

Strategic Highlights

On behalf of Afghanistan-Pakistan Women's Economic Empowerment (APWEE), we extend our heartfelt gratitude for your compassion and generosity throughout 2024 (1445-46 AH). Afghanistan endured another year marked by profound hardship. Recurring floods and other natural disasters compounded an already severe humanitarian crisis characterized by widespread hunger, poverty, and limited economic opportunities with women and children bearing a disproportionate share of the burden. In response, APWEE continued to focus its efforts on Afghanistan while remaining steadfast in its broader mission.

Thanks to your support, APWEE provided emergency food packages to 107 vulnerable women in the Afghan provinces of Laghman, Kabul, Kunar, and Nangarhar. These packages included essential staples and household supplies such as cooking oil, wheat, rice, pasta, beans, lentils, peas, green tea, sugar, salt, soap, and dishwashing liquid.

Following devastating floods in the Afghan province of Baghlan, we distributed blankets, tents, cookware, cooking gas and oil, and other necessities to 100 affected individuals, prioritizing female widows and other disadvantaged women. We also delivered emergency food assistance to 30 malnourished women and their children on the outskirts of Jalalabad, helping to restore their health and dignity during a time of acute need.

Beyond emergency relief, APWEE invested in sustainable livelihoods by awarding a small business grant to a woman entrepreneur in Kabul whose tailoring and handicrafts enterprise employs more than 15 widowed and disabled women. By providing solar panels and related equipment to power her sewing machines, we helped safeguard the business, preserve jobs, and strengthen the well-being of numerous families who depend on this source of income.

In view of the continued humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan, APWEE focused on providing life-saving assistance to disadvantage Afghan women.

Looking Ahead

As we look ahead, APWEE remains unwavering in its commitment to stand beside women who are poor, distressed, and underprivileged in Afghanistan and Pakistan. We will continue to expand access to education and economic opportunity by providing Google Career Certificate Scholarships to women in Afghanistan and sustaining our support for STEM scholarships that empower talented young women in Balochistan, Pakistan. With your continued partnership, we will persist in delivering life-saving assistance, fostering self-reliance, and advancing hope where it is needed most.

PROJECT SUMMARY

- APWEE provided 107 disadvantaged women in Laghman, Kabul, Kunar, and Nangarhar, Afghanistan with emergency food packages, including cooking oil, wheat, rice, pasta, beans, lentils, peas, green tea, salt, sugar, soap, and/or dishwashing liquid, among other things.



- APWEE distributed blankets, tents, cookware such as ovens, pots, bowls, and utensils, and cooking gas and oil, among other essential items, to 100 flood victims, prioritizing disadvantaged women including but not limited to female widows, in Baghlan, Afghanistan.



- APWEE provided emergency food assistance, including cooking oil, flour, rice, beans, chickpeas, lentils, and milk to 30 disadvantaged women, including but not limited to widows, and their children, facing malnutrition, in the outskirts of Jalalabad, Nangarhar, Afghanistan.



- APWEE issued a small business grant to a woman in Kabul, Afghanistan, who employs over 15 widowed and disabled women in her tailoring and handicrafts business, supplying solar panels and related equipment to power her sewing machines.
