

According to both the King James Version and the **unabridged Ethiopian Orthodox Scriptures (specifically the 81-Book Canon, including the Book of Jubilees / *Metsehafe Kufale*, the Book of Enoch / *Metsehafe Henok*, and the *Fetha Nagast* / Law Code)**, the Creator does not have two different sets of laws.

The scripture explicitly establishes **One Law** for both the physical, homeborn children of Israel and the grafted Gentiles who join the covenant family.

"One law shall be to him that is homeborn, and unto the stranger that sojourneth among you."

— **Exodus 12:49 (KJV)**

The fundamental categories of laws, commandments, and statutes expected of all citizens of the Kingdom are outlined below, categorized by thematic domain, with their dual scriptural foundations.

1. The Core Foundation: The Ten Commandments (*The Ten Words*)

These ten laws serve as the constitutional foundation of the entire Kingdom matrix. They were uttered directly by the voice of the Creator at Sinai and written with His finger on tablets of stone.

6. Prohibition of Murder	Exodus 20:13	Jubilees 7:27–28; 1 Enoch 98:12
7. Absolute Marital Purity (No Adultery)	Exodus 20:14	Jubilees 30:7–17; 39:6
8. Prohibition of Theft / Kidnapping	Exodus 20:15	Jubilees 36:8; 1 Enoch 99:13
9. Truthful Testimony (No False Witness)	Exodus 20:16	Jubilees 36:8; 1 Enoch 95:6
10. Guarding the Heart (No Covetousness)	Exodus 20:17	Jubilees 36:9; Sirach 5:1–8

2. The Holy Feasts & Sacred Appointed Times (*Moedim*)

The Father expects His people to operate on His cosmic calendar rather than the pagan calendars of the 70 Gentile nations. These appointed times are physical rehearsals for spiritual events on the timeline.

- **The Weekly Seventh-Day Sabbath:** Rest from all commercial and physical labor starting Friday sunset to Saturday sunset.

- **KJV: Leviticus 23:3**
- **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 2:25–33** (*Decreed as an eternal sign for Israel and the righteous*)
- **The Passover (*Pesach*) & Unleavened Bread (*Matzot*):** Remembering redemption from slavery and walking free from sin (*chametz*).
 - **KJV: Leviticus 23:4–8, 1 Corinthians 5:7–8**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 49:1–23**
- **Firstfruits (*Bikkurim*) & Pentecost (*Shavuot*):** Celebrating the giving of the Torah and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 23:15–21, Acts 2:1**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 6:15–22** (*The Feast of Covenants*)
- **The Day of Trumpets (*Yom Teruah*):** Blowing trumpets to signal the wake-up call and the final hour.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 23:23–25**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 31:3, 1 Enoch 104**
- **The Day of Atonement (*Yom Kippur*):** Fasting, self-affliction, and national cleansing.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 23:26–32**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 34:12–19**
- **The Feast of Tabernacles (*Sukkot*):** Dwelling in temporary shelters, rejoicing in the Kingdom.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 23:33–44**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 16:20–31** (*First kept by Abraham*)

3. Dietary Laws (*Clean vs. Unclean*)

To keep the physical temple clean for the Holy Spirit to inhabit, the Creator set strict dietary boundaries regarding what enters the human body.

- **Land Animals:** Eating only animals with a split hoof that chew the cud (e.g., beef, lamb, goat, deer). Swine, pork, and carnivores are strictly forbidden.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 11:1–8, Deuteronomy 14:3–8**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 6:7, Fetha Nagast Chapter 28**
- **Sea Life:** Eating only water creatures that possess both fins and scales. Shellfish, shrimp, crabs, and catfish are abominations.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 11:9–12**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Fetha Nagast Chapter 28**
- **Prohibition of Blood & Strangled Meat:** Consuming blood in any form is forbidden, as the life/soul resides in the blood.
 - **KJV: Genesis 9:4, Leviticus 17:10–14, Acts 15:20**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 6:12–14** (*Noah's strict warning on blood*)

4. Moral, Sexual, & Social Statutes

The citizens of the Kingdom are required to stand out in stark contrast to the lawless practices of the 70 Gentile nations.

- **Sexual Purity & Natural Order:** Total prohibition of incest, homosexuality, bestiality, and fornication.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 18:1–30, Leviticus 20:10–21, 1 Corinthians 6:9–10**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 16:5–6** (*The Sin of Sodom*), **Jubilees 30:7–17**
- **Distinction of Genders in Attire:** Men must dress as men, and women must dress as women.

- **KJV: Deuteronomy 22:5**
- **Ethiopian Canon: Fetha Nagast Chapter 24**
- **Prohibition of Sorcery, Mediums, & Witchcraft:** No consulting mediums, horoscopes, tarot, or occult frequencies.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 19:31, Deuteronomy 18:9–12, Galatians 5:19–21**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: 1 Enoch 7:1–6 (The forbidden arts taught by the Watchers), Jubilees 11:8**

5. The Royal Law of Love & Community

All statutes are summed up in two master principles that direct how love is expressed horizontally and vertically:

*"Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind... And the second is like unto it, **Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself**. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."* — **Matthew 22:37–40 (KJV)**

- **Love for the Sovereign:** Expressed through obedience to His statutes (**1 John 5:3, Jubilees 20:2**).
- **Care for the Widow, Orphan, and Poor:** Giving tithes, alms, and ensuring the vulnerable are protected.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 19:9–10, Deuteronomy 24:19–22, James 1:27**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Sirach 4:1–10, Tobit 4:7–11**
- **Loving the Stranger/Grafted Convert:** Treating the converted Gentile with the exact same honor, equality, and protection as the homeborn Israelite.
 - **KJV: Leviticus 19:33–34, Deuteronomy 10:19**
 - **Ethiopian Canon: Jubilees 20:4–5, Fetha Nagast Chapter 30**

Summary for the Saints

These laws and statutes are not an "exhausting burden" meant to produce legalism. Under the **New Covenant**, the **Holy Spirit** lives inside your physical body, giving you the internal power, desire, and wisdom to keep these instructions naturally. By keeping these boundaries, you remain wrapped in the **Blood of our Lord** and shielded by the Holy Spirit as an active, shining ambassador of the Kingdom!
