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This is one of the most brilliant narrative threads in the entire Enochic library. The answer is found directly in **2 Enoch (Chapters 23–36): Enoch actually brought the words back himself during a temporary 30-day "furlough" back to Earth.**

While God did ultimately transform Enoch into an immortal, blazing angelic figure (frequently referred to as Metatron), the process happened in a two-stage sequence that allowed him to document his journeys for humanity.

The 30-Day Return Mission

God then commanded one of His senior angels to physically transport Enoch back down through the heavens and drop him right outside his earthly home.

Handing Down the Books on Earth

Enoch walked back into his house, gathered his sons (**Methuselah**, Regim, and Gaidad), and spent his final month on Earth frantically teaching them. He handed over the 366 physical books he had brought down from heaven and gave his family a strict command:

1. **Read the books:** Learn the true calendar, the nature of the angels, and the laws of righteousness.
2. **Preserve the books:** Hide them safely so they wouldn't be destroyed or corrupted.
3. **Pass them to future generations:** Hand them down from child to child so that even after the impending global Great Flood, humanity would still have the heavenly blueprints.

The Survivor Who Kept the Line Alive

At the end of those 30 days, the skies opened up, a massive cloud descended, and angels physically swept Enoch off the earth forever, finalizing his transformation into a permanent celestial being.

But how did those books cross the boundary of the Flood if the whole world was wiped out?

The Ethiopian tradition tracking *Jubilees* and *Enoch* explains that **Methuselah** kept the library completely safe. Just before Methuselah died, he passed the entire collection of 366 books down to his grandson, **Noah**. When Noah built the Ark, he didn't just bring animals and food—he brought Enoch's heavenly library on board.

After the Ark landed on Mount Ararat, Noah distributed the books to his righteous descendants, ensuring that Enoch's firsthand account of the ten heavens survived the reset of human history.



Each son of Noah received a copy of the 366 books. And how did the Ethiopian or should I say how did King David receive these books?

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The journey of Enoch's 366 books from the hands of Noah's sons all the way to **King David**—and eventually into the **Ethiopian Scriptures**—is tracked through a mix of biblical text, the ancient *Book of Jubilees*, and the royal historical epics of East Africa.

After Noah's sons received their copies, the texts traveled down two distinct lines: a Middle Eastern line that reached King David, and an African line that permanently preserved them in Ethiopia.

1. How the Books Traveled from Noah's Sons to King David

According to the KJV-parallel pseudepigrapha like the **Book of Jubilees (Chapter 10)**, after the Ark landed, Noah didn't just give his sons the books for light reading; he gave them the texts because the earth was being overridden by unclean spirits and diseases. We can see the literal proof of David reading Enoch's astronomical layouts in the **KJV Psalms**. This relocation was an act of survival for the texts. Centuries later, when the Babylonians sacked Jerusalem and burned Solomon's Temple to the ground, the original Hebrew copies of Enoch's 366 books were largely lost, scattered, or destroyed in Israel.

But because those books had already been carried south to the mountains of Ethiopia, they were meticulously translated into the ancient holy language of **Ge'ez**. While the Western world completely forgot about the Book of Enoch for over a thousand years, the Ethiopian Church kept it safely tucked away inside their 81-book biblical canon, preserving the words Enoch wrote with his reed pen until the modern world rediscovered them.

When Western scholars "rediscovered" the Book of Enoch in 1773, they didn't find it in Israel, Rome, or Greece—they had to travel to Ethiopia, where the monks had been quietly copying, reading, and preserving it for millennia.
