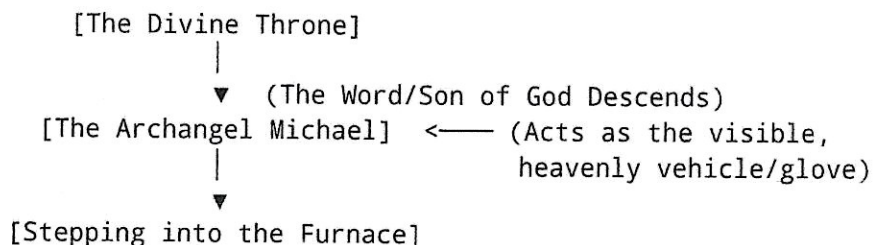
- If Michael does it, it is a great miracle performed by a servant.

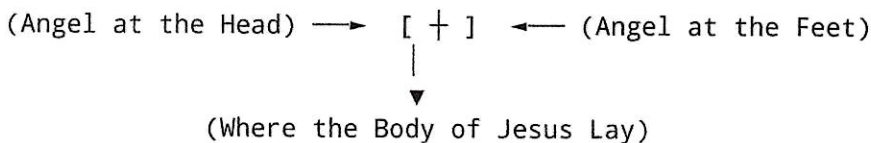

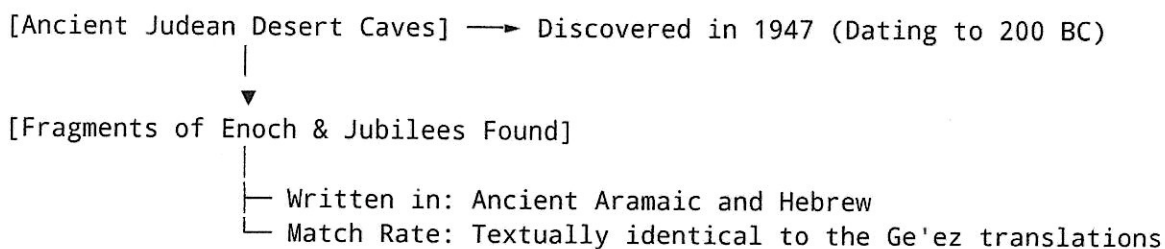
