I contacted a man online.



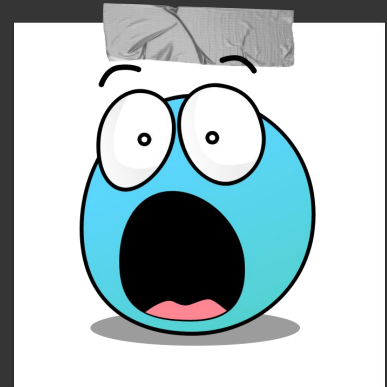


The man I connected with told me that my firewall was compromised, but he could fix it and set up better virus protection for \$200. I paid the money, and a few days later he called to see how things were working.

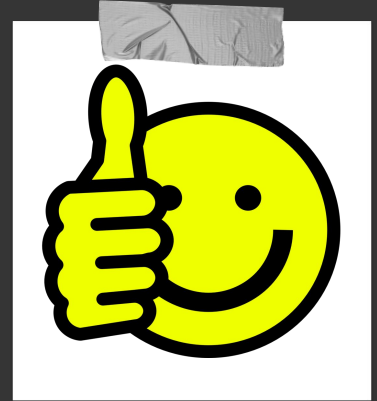
Yesterday, during Creative Writing class, my computer began to malfunction. Then a picture of a nude woman flashed on the screen.

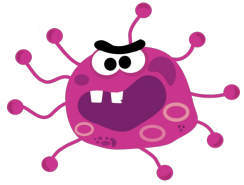

drive.



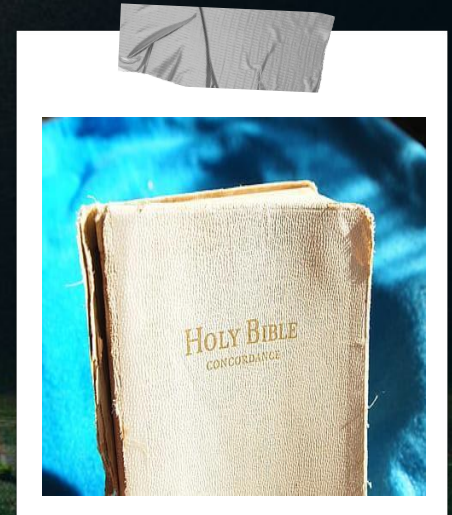


"Take heed what you hear. With the same measure you use, it will be measured to you; and to you who hear, more will be given..."

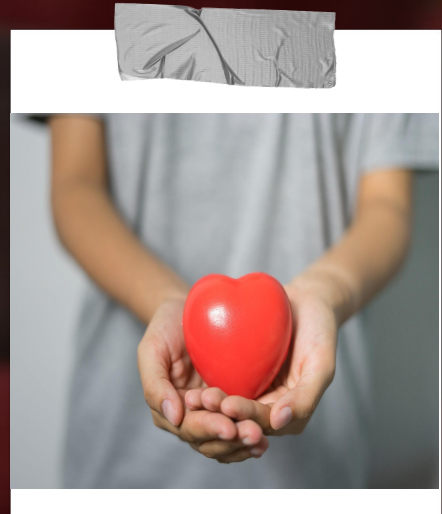
Mark 4:24

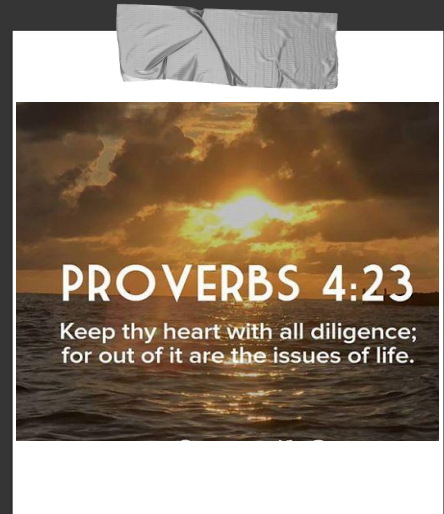



Be diligent in guarding your heart,
