




Romans 6:23 tells us, “*The **wages** of sin is death.*”


Jesus collects our earnings so we don't have to.

That's love! ❤️




"It Wasn't a Payment"

That for every sin, the debt was strong.


“Jesus paid it all,” we sing.
But now let truth's profound words ring.




The wages of sin, we know, are death.
