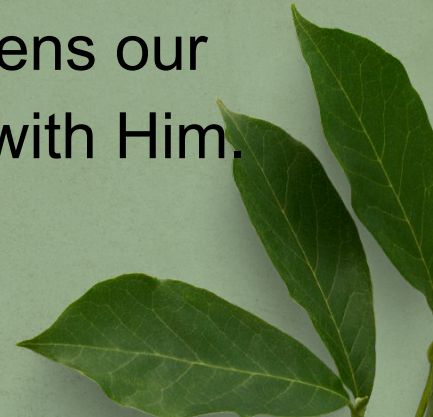




God is a loving Father who sent Jesus out of love, not to punish.
