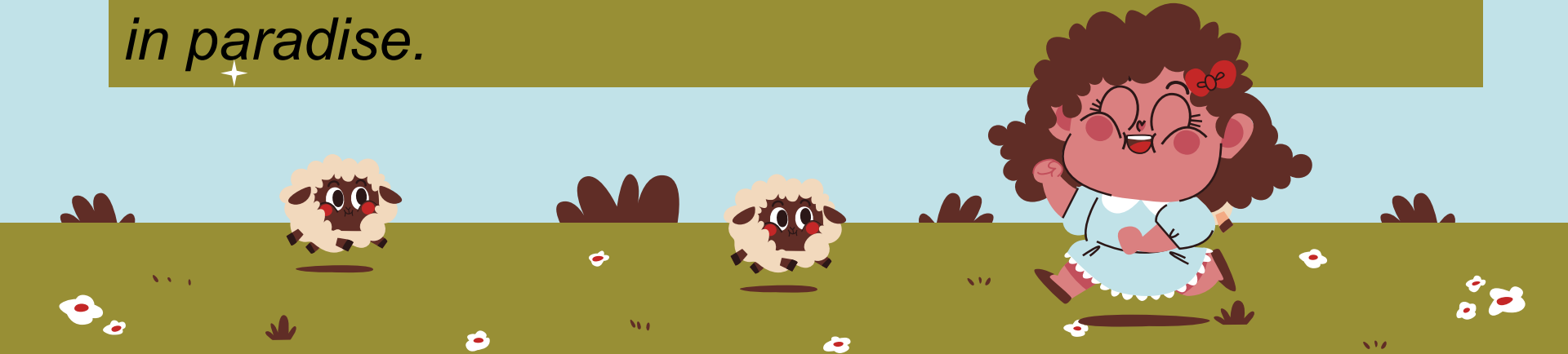


The World's First Homeschool
