# CITIZEN VOLUNTEERS MONROE EMERGENCY RESPONSE CORPS

#### **EVACUATION ZONES AND SHELTERS**

Monroe County has a comprehensive plan that calls for phased evacuation with five zones established from MM 0 to Ocean Reef. The evacuation plan is intended to avoid unnecessary evacuation, if some zones are expected to be affected and others not. Here are the zones relevant to our neighborhood if local officials order evacuations.

Zone 1: MM 0 to MM 6 Zone 2: MM 6 to MM 40

**Shelter locations for Category 1-2 Hurricanes**Key West High School 2100 Flagler Avenue

Sugarloaf School MM 19, US 1

Marathon High School MM 50 350 Sombrero Beach Road



#### RE-ENTRY STICKERS

Residents may obtain one sticker for each registered vehicle by providing proof of residency at a Monroe County Tax Collector's Office. Proof of residency includes a Florida Drivers License and vehicle registration, or a property bill with an out of county vehicle registration for out of county residents who own a home in Monroe County. The new system is barcoded with color-coded stickers for zone by zone reentry. (We're Dark Pink, #1). These stickers

make reentry easier if checkpoints are required to assure safe entry into

the Keys.




