

The Trinity

(What is Trinity and Supernatural?)

Believe in the truth of the Bible. What is supernatural? What does supernatural mean?

The Bible is a training manual for life according to 2 Timothy 3: 16 and 17 which says “ALL** Scripture is God-breathed (inspired by God to all the authors of the Bible) and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant (you and me as Christians) of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work”.**

The dictionary definition of natural is of, existing in, or produced by nature scientifically proven. It is normal or to be expected; ordinary or logical.

We as humans living on earth experience everything that is normal in nature. When Jesus was living with us on earth and performing miracles, His miracles were not normal or natural to us. When Jesus turned water into wine, that was not normal or natural to us because we have not experienced anything like that in the history of mankind, past, present, or future. When Jesus healed a blind man, that was not natural because to us that would be impossible.

So, when Jesus performed miracles, they were done supernaturally because they were not natural to us and could not be explained scientifically.

The definition of supernatural is of a manifestation or event attributed to some force beyond scientific understanding or the laws of nature.

So, based on what we know about supernatural, brings us to the topic of the Trinity. What we “know” about the Trinity is that there is a father, a son, and a spirit. Each one being a deity.

We also know that supernaturally, the Trinity is one God (the God we worship). If the meaning of Trinity is 3 in 1, how can that be because to us that is not natural? It is mathematically impossible. We can try to explain it by putting the word God in front of each deity such as God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit which we “know” that there is one God because of what God told Moses in the Ten Commandments. On the third commandment it says, “You shall not have no other gods besides me”.

Therefore, the Trinity becomes one God called the Triune God with triune meaning 3 in 1 (supernaturally).

My sweet wife gave me an analogy of the Triune God when she said “I (meaning me) am three persons in one by name only. First, I am a husband. Second, I am a father. Third, I am a grandfather.” Therefore, I am a triune man in name only. I am NOT a trinity because that is reserved for deity.

A member of my Bible study class named Steve said that” a lot of people put the Trinity on a triangle with each deity on each point which is better defined with each deity on a circle and not separated”.

I got into a discussion about Trinity with my granddaughter Esther. I asked her if she thought the Triune God in heaven was separated such as Jesus and the Father (God) and she said: “yes based on a Bible verse which says that ‘Jesus went to heaven to sit at the right hand of God’” and she believes in the truth of the Bible. The Triune God in heaven is not separated and I tried to explain to her supernaturally that the Bible verse was true, and the explanation went like this: “God is sitting on His throne in heaven with his right hand resting on the right arm rest. Jesus went to heaven and sat down on that same throne and the right hand of God’s hand became the right hand of Jesus”. I believe that there is one throne in heaven, and there is one ruler sitting on it.

Now that doesn't sound possible, but supernaturally it could be. Everything we know about heaven is supernatural and we could recognize God the Father as Jesus. Jesus tells us in the Bible that He is God, but He separates Himself from the Father because the Trinity is confusing and people are not prepared for the supernatural. When Jesus was talking to Nicodemus, He said "if you have seen me, you have seen the Father". This tells me that Jesus and the Father are the same deity. Can you make up your own mind or only imagine.

The simple fact is we don't "know" what heaven is like because of the supernatural.

In conclusion, we "know" that the Trinity is three deities and that is defined as supernatural. What we don't "know" is how we will see Jesus in heaven because we can only imagine. "The disparity between the glorious and eternal realm and the world is beyond understanding". This sentence is in reference to I Cor. 2:9 when it talks about the mind. Jesus separated himself from God the Father when He came to earth because the mind of people is not prepared for the supernatural.
