
Wyoming Pre-Licensure Registered Nurse Pipeline 2014-2015

The vast majority of students in Wyoming are from Wyoming and the surrounding states.




Figure 2. Age of Nursing Students



The vast majority of nursing students in Wyoming are white/caucasian.




Figure 4. Licensure: NCLEX-RN Pass Rate for Wyoming


