Sean Noble



Political Strategist

Sean Noble is a long-time political and policy strategist and a pioneer in independent expenditure campaigns. Sean worked for a decade as chief of staff for Congressman John Shadegg (R-AZ), and along the way he became the go to campaign advisor for conservatives and conservative issues from his home state of Arizona to Washington, DC. He is an expert in messaging, strategy, and tactics in the policy and political arena. Sean has managed both state-based and national issue advocacy campaigns and managed independent expenditure efforts for President, U.S. Senate, Governors, and Congress. He has also managed candidate campaigns for Congress, U.S. Senate, Governor, State Legislature, and ballot initiatives. He is also a co-host of the podcast "Light Beer Dark Money."

Councilmember Rich Adams



District 1 (Northwest Mesa)

Elected in November 2024, Rich Adams began his first term on the Mesa City Council in January 2025 and will serve through January 2029. His priorities include public safety, fiscal responsibility, government transparency, and ensuring the City operates within its Charter. In District 1, he focuses on safe neighborhoods, responsible infill development, support for local businesses, and responsiveness to residents.

A lifelong Mesa resident since 1963 and a graduate of Mesa Public Schools and Westwood High School, Rich has volunteered in the community for over 35 years. His service includes leadership roles on the Planning and Zoning Board, Economic Development Advisory Board, Falcon Area Visioning Commission, Visit Mesa Board, and the Mesa General Plan Committee. He is a graduate of Mesa Leadership (Class of 1989) and Valley Leadership (Class XXI), and has completed both the Mesa Fire & Medical Citizens Fire Academy and the Mesa Police Citizens Police Academy.

Rich was named **Mesa Citizen of the Year** in 2019 and received the **International Economic Development Council's Citizen Leadership Award** in 2021. He currently serves as Chair of the City's Economic Development Committee and is a member of the Public Safety and Sustainability & Transportation Committees, as well as the Arizona Museum of Natural History Board.

Professionally, Rich is President and CEO of a regional trade association founded in 1883, a founding Director of Gateway Commercial Bank of Mesa, and brings over 40 years of experience in business and commercial credit management. He holds the CCE, CCP, and CAE professional designations. Rich and his wife Karen have five adult children and four grandchildren. Family, faith, and service are central to his life, and he enjoys backpacking, skiing, camping, and time with his grandchildren.

Councilmember Alicia Goforth



District 5 (Northeast Mesa)

Elected in August 2022, Alicia Goforth began her first term on the Mesa City Council in January 2023, serving through January 2027. Her priorities focus on community planning, economic development, and supporting sustainable growth across Northeast Mesa.

Alicia has lived in Mesa for 15 years with her husband and three children. She is an experienced attorney, previously practicing at Shook, Hardy & Bacon LLP and later serving as in-house counsel for Cerner Corporation (Oracle Cerner), with expertise in corporate, finance, and software licensing matters. She is admitted to practice law in Arizona, Missouri, and Kansas.

A dedicated volunteer, Alicia has supported schools, intercultural programs, and local community initiatives, including AFS Intercultural Programs. In Las Sendas, she served on multiple committees, including Chair of the Community Planning Advisory Group, and held leadership roles on the Board of Directors for three years, helping guide long-term community planning.

On the City Council, Alicia serves as Chair of the Audit, Finance & Enterprise Committee and is a member of the Economic Development and Sustainability & Transportation Committees. She also serves on boards including the Arizona Museum of Natural History, Visit Mesa, and participates in state and national committees supporting cities and infrastructure development.

District 2 (Central & Southcentral Mesa)

Dorean Taylor has proudly called Mesa home for nearly two decades. Together with her husband, a Mesa native, she has built a strong family and

business life in the city, actively participating in her church and neighborhood community.
