DFF MENTOR PROGRAM

The Delta Fly Fishers Board of Directors, intent upon enhancing the existing Fishing Buddy Program, is proposing DFF adopt a Mentor Program which is proactive and broadly inclusive. The primary objective is, by sharing fly fishing skills and knowledge of existing DFF members with new members, this will assist new members in getting acquainted with existing members, with club activities and, generally speed the transition from new member to old friend.

The Board of Directors recognizes this will take considerable commitment from the existing membership and does encourage the active participation of current members. The following broad guidelines are thought to be necessary for this program.

- Every existing member willing to serve, as a Mentor will be asked to complete a skills/knowledge list that they will share with new members as requested. The Mentor Program Chairperson will maintain these documents.
- Every new member will be asked to complete a skills/knowledge request form, which the Mentor Program Chair will also maintain.
- The Mentor Program Chair will introduce any and all new members before the General Program begins and will make an effort to introduce the new members to DFF Officers and Board Members.
- Under consideration is the additional incentive for new members of some free raffle tickets.
- The Mentor Program Chair will follow up on matching a Mentor with a new member based on skills/knowledge sought and skills/knowledge available. The mentor and new member will work out a compatible schedule by which to transfer skills/knowledge. The Mentor Program Chair as needed can make reassignments.
- Examples of mentoring include such things as guiding a new member on local waters within a few months of assignment, accompany the new member to a local fly shop to assist with gear purchases, contact the new member a few days before each monthly meeting to remind the new member of the meeting and program, assisting with casting skills, how to tie useful knots and/or fly tying, sharing information regarding fly fishing destinations including basic travel tips and promoting new members to join DFF in its outings

Over time the Mentor Program may be extended to include existing members who want to learn new skills/knowledge.

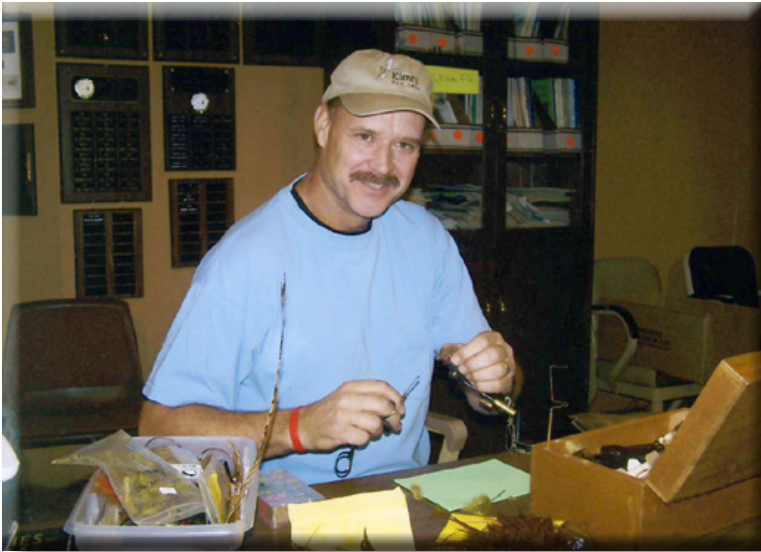

Although liberal new fishing regulations and alternative fish species allow fishing year-round, our preferences and weather has side-lined most of us until now. New fly fishers are especially hesitant to take advantage of the early fishing season due to their lack of experience in fly fishing and locations suitable for this method of angling.

One of the best means to get started is to join the club's scheduled fishing outings – they are usually scheduled at the best seasons for fly fishing. They usually have a dedicated host who can help new members on what equipment to bring and can answer questions concerning angling techniques suitable for the specific watercourse. Eastern Sierra Focus

Fishing conditions:

Mother Nature just got a load of ungratefulness for the copious amount of cold temps and blowing snow. She really needs to take something for her migraine, and I can recommend Fiorinol. I view her as sitting there observing the situation and determining how long she plans to gift us with her surprises.

Last year's stocking numbers were up from 422K pounds to 504K pounds in spite of early season obstacles generated by environmental groups utilizing the willow flycatcher as a tool to sidetrack trout stocking operations. IAG (Alpers beauties) swing into high gear and generated 52,290lbs of hawks to the 10lb class for local waters from both Inyo and Mono counties.

Fish and Game recently stated they will be increasing their stocking from about 7 to 8% over last year. Early 2011 also reported some problems with stocking browns, but this was resolved and will be a viable resource at the end of your 3X.

Alpers will be stocking all open waters and resume with his normal program when the remaining ice is off all the lakes.

Next season has a new item, a proposal to eliminate the barbless hook, catch-and-release regulations for lower Rush Ck from Hwy. 395 downstream to Mono Lake, roughly six miles of water. Next step is receiving input from DFG.

Be safe if you cross streams and remember the water is exceedingly cold this time of year. Don't take unnecessary chances, keep a solar blanket in your fly/tackle vest and be realistic about your physical ability to handle high water flows.

A wading staff IS NOW a consideration.

News – Plan ahead--purchase your fishing license ON-LINE.

Legislation - Rumors abound, will report next month. This is going to be good should it pass muster.

Assembly Bill 7, passed in 2005 required the DFG to spend fishing license money on stocking, but a Senate budget subcommittee has diverted \$4 million for an unrelated purpose. Sen. Doug LaMalfa drafted SB505 that would require the Department meet mandated fish planting requirements, even if it means purchasing trout from private sources. Regardless, the subcommittee voted 201 to shift \$4 million in license revenue to pay for timber restoration projects rather than spending it directly on fish plants. Sen. A. Lowenthal (D) of Long Beach and J. Simitian (D) of Palo Alto both voted for the proposal claiming that improving the forests benefits streams, but Se. Jean Fuller (R) of Bakersfield voted again it.

Fishing Report: All waters above 8700' still frozen. Remember to check the regulations prior to fishing unfamiliar water as to limits, size, and gear.

ROCK CREEK – The road is open with a little water at the inlet and outlet. Resort plans to open Memorial weekend.

HOT CREEK – With the normal breezy afternoons try #20-22 midges early, then go to midges patterns early then mayfly emergers mid-day to around 2 p.m., the smaller (#18-20) the better. Warm weather will induce some hatches despite the cool temps. Please stay out of the water to and help prevent the spread of New Zealand mud snails.

CROWLEY LAKE – Is almost full and crowds were down for the opener with a lot of issues about the catching. Last fall saw a large number of fish planted for the 2011 spring, and recently 35-40 thousand browns were stocked.

UPPER OWENS – Is cold with steady flows, the best spot has been below the monument to the lake with egg patterns on the bottom. Try several midges pattern and test the waters. Temps are supposed to increase in the next few days and this should produce more hatches.

CONVICT – Was stocked with brutes and had mixed reports with good and bad days due to the weather. You're on your own here, but I'd try mostly dark woollies size 8, and Olive Hornbergs size 8.

MAMMOTH BASIN - Has started to thaw and showing more water all the time. Twins are almost fully open, but it's cold up there, so get some thicker fleece for under those Simms.

SAN JOAQUIN ROAD – Plowing will not start until May 10th as usual, due to the number of skiers taking advantage of the added snow on the Mountain. Check with Forest Service in Mammoth Lakes for an exact opening date.

JUNE LAKE – June loop iced out early this spring and fishing was on the slow side with not as many anglers after opening.

GULL LAKE – Hawks are still there, so get up here and give it a shot, anything goes that you've used here before, so sharpen up those hooks and dust off the plumes and hit the water before the summer crowds arrive.

SILVER LAKE RESORT - Is in full operation and RV camping is available, campground opened Apr 27th. Rush Creek is in good shape but a bit high. Federation of Fly Fishers Southwest Council (FFFSWC) is holding their annual Rush Creek cleanup on June 25th. If you want to help, email me (vlr@qnet.com) and I'll get you the info.

GRANT LAKE – Water is cold and clear, and Grant is full with good reports on fishing.

LUNDY LAKE – The Lake is ice free but low which is normal for this time of year, and the Resort plans to open Memorial weekend. The campgrounds are open.

VIRGINIA LAKES – The road is open to Big Virginia, and the resort plans to open May 27th. The ice on Little Virginia is under 22" and Big Virginia is approx 32" and both have started to turn icy blue.

EAST WALKER – Flow as of this writing is 327cfs, and fishing has been very good according to Jim Reed of Ken's in Bridgeport. He also stated that there have been some 6 to 20-fish days, but the weather has been a huge factor in the catch. Fish from the "big hole" all the way down to just beyond the bridge, then just past the first 40 mph curve.

BRIDGEPORT RESERVOIR - Is off-color and very full. DFG stocked a lot fish last fall. Buckeye Bay has been the best choice with midges in the morning and (Zebra, San Juan worms, blood midge) and mayfly patterns later in the day if the temperature rises. It's been somewhat slow, so get your gear-head ready for a test of skills.

WEST WALKER – Flow is 882cfs. Water is off-color and running high, best recommendation is to try the flat water near the bridge down to Chris Flat. Try some nice attractors over Bird's nest, pheasant tail or Juan worms.

TIOGA PASS – Park Service is just past Yosemite Creek, and the County equipment just entered the main gate 5 days ago, but reports are still dismal for opening before June 25th.

SONORA PASS – The road crew is at a standstill as they are waiting for their equipment repairs.

MONITOR PASS – Is open, then closed, then open, then closed, but tomorrow the sun should shine. CJ 11.5.26
