Conservation by Ron Forbes

This year will be a monumental year in California's ongoing fight in the water wars. Given the strong possibility of a third year of drought, farmers, urban water districts and environmentalists-fishermen see 2009 as a year in which decisions will be made that will affect our state for decades to come. Some of the major issues will be Schwarzenegger's ongoing push for a peripheral canal, the decline of pelagic animals in the delta, pollution (toxins) in our water ways, the reclaiming of the San Joaquin River, the continuing loss of our salmon and steelhead and the ongoing demand for more taxpayer subsidized water for corporate agribusiness. These are just some of the issues in front of us this year, and there will be others.

We really need to keep our attention focused on the governor's actions. Arnold Schwarzenegger approached, then, President-elect Obama to suspend or eliminate the National Environmental Impact Review in Obama's proposed economic stimulus in California. He has also is trying to weaken California's environmental laws to help him proceed with construction of a peripheral canal. He waited until his handpicked of team, the so called "blue ribbon" Delta Vision Committee, found in favor of building a canal. Of course there are no members on that committee who are from the delta. They are all outsiders. Now he is preceding full bore to build the canal.

Since the voters voted down the last attempt for a peripheral canal 18 years ago, he is trying a new approach. He is trying to start building the canal without taking it to a vote of the people and he is going to try to attempt to bypass the House and Assembly in Sacramento. He wants over 9 billion dollars of our money for the canal. And that is projected not to be the full amount needed. All this without any mention of environmental protections for our Delta despite the overwhelming problems the delta faces. All this without real science to show what will happen to the Delta if a peripheral canal is build. At a meeting this last week I learned that the DWR has sent out over 4,000 letters to landowners along the proposed rout of the canal. The letter informs them that their land will be entered to evaluate their property for possible eminent domain status. What stupendous audacity!

More Problems for The Striped Bass

In a study published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences last November, David Ostrach of UCD has reported another serious problem in the Delta. Female stripers are taking in toxins and these toxins are passed to their eggs. These toxins consist of pesticides, industrial chemicals and flame retardants. The offspring of these fish have underdeveloped brains, an inadequate energy levels and livers that are dysfunctional. Ostrach says, "This study is one of the first studies examining the effects of real world contaminant-mixtures on growth and development in wildlife." His study is useful for two reasons. One is that they are an indicator of the health of the estuary system and second is that the levels of contaminants and effect on the stripers can predict the same for people.

This should be of real concern since the Delta is California's major source of urban water supply and for agriculture. According to Ostrach's report it's also one of the most contaminated aquatic ecosystems in the world. It supplies 2/3 of the drinking water for the people of California and water for most of the farms. Ostrach ask the question if the fish living in the water are not healthy and pass these toxins on to their young, what is happening to the people who use that same water or who will eat the fish? It's known that one of these toxins found in this study (PDBE) has been found in Bay Area's mother's breast milk in levels that are 100 times greater than in the milk from mothers in other parts of the world. The UCD research group found harmful levels of PCB, PBDE and 16 other pesticides. These toxins seem to have three major problems. They cause skeletal and organ deformities and dysfunction, changes in hormone functions and changes in behavior.

One important part of the study compared gravid females caught in the upper Sacramento River and compared them to offspring of uncontaminated fish that were raised in a hatchery. The river fish showed harmful amounts of PBDE, PCB and 16 pesticides. The hatchery fish don't.

It should be noted by those who follow what goes on with the Department of Water Resources, that DWR's Pelagic Organism Decline Managers had funded the research of this project. When some of the results were reported, they killed all of Ostrach's and his colleagues funding. However, new funding is being sought so the research can continue. They seem to want to continue to hide some of the massive problems they have created in the Delta. And their present actions continue to help destroy the delta.

FFF Conservation

The Steelhead Committee has been busy the last few months. First, the FFF Web pages on The Osprey have been expanded and improved upon to include more information about steelhead and salmon issues, and easier navigation for more information on The Osprey. Visit our website and browse back issues of The Osprey.

The Steelhead Committee has also just launched a blog dedicated to salmon and steelhead issues. The Steelhead Committee believes the first step towards conservation and recovery of our anadromous fish is an informed community of advocates. Through our publication The Osprey, our website and this blog we hope to share relevant news regarding the management, science and politics surrounding steelhead and salmon in the Pacific Northwest. 




Oak Grove Parking

February General Meeting The California Heritage Trout Challenge



Phil Erickson will give a presentation on his experiences taking the California Heritage Trout Challenge beginning in 2006. His presentation will cover; what the challenge is about, the fish, the fishing, the places and the people involved. He is one of only seven fishermen who have caught all eleven species in their heritage waters.

A second generation native Californian, he began fishing in Yosemite National Park about the age of nine or ten, and like most young fishermen, he started out with worms and Salmon eggs, then progressed to spinning gear and decided to switch to flies when he observed trout rising to flies on back packing trips into the High Sierras during the 1960's. I have been a fly rod packing trout bum ever since!

He no longer limits his fishing only for trout as he now fishes for both fresh and saltwater species in places like, Alaska, Baja, Belize, British Columbia, Christmas Island, Costa Rica and Patagonia. However trout (and the Steelhead version) are still his passion. He fishes approximately sixty days a year, with about half of that in California.






