The March Program:

Topwater Delta bassin' is a heart stopper

The March program is being presented by one of our own, Jerry Neuburger. Jerry guided the Delta for stripers from 2003 to 2914 and while doing so, discovered a thriving largemouth bass fishery. In fact, the fishery became his prime target from late May through August.

Those twelve years of on the water experience helped him learn the habits of what some people call America's Game

Fish, and hone his fly fishing skills and techniques for hooking this exciting species.

Jerry will cover the recommended equipment for "topwater bassin", the techniques and presentations, and the where and when to fish for this species.

In additional to the speaker's presentation, Mike Dempewolf will be there with a tray load of goodies to eat and coffee and soft drinks.

The monthly raffle will feather an eight weight

rod, Okuma reel (donated by Sam Thompson) and a 9/10 floating line, perfect for topwater bassing on the delta as well as topwater striper presentations.

The meeting will take place at the John R. Williams School, 2450 Meadow Avenue, Stockton, on March 11th. The doors open at 6:30pm, program starts at 7. The public is encouraged to attend.

The Bob McMillan Trout Bout is this Saturday, Calling all volunteers

Club member Charlie Reames has stepped up (again!) and is heading up the coming Trout Bout. He needs your help. The club's community service at the San Joaquin County Parks and Rec's three fishing derbies is a way to pay the county back for the use of Oak Grove Park and the Nature Center. The relationship has gone on for well over 30 years.

Charlie and a few others will have purchased the supplies but need help setting up. Five volunteers are needed to arrive at the park about 5:45. They should enter through the maintenance yard entrance and go directly to the boat house on the west side of the park. Another dozen volunteers are needed between seven and eight to prepare the food, man the golf carts and work the food counter.

The event ends early, with awards to the winners passed out at 1pm. All the volunteers are usually able to finish shortly after.

NEW MEMBERS, while this is a public service project, it is also a great way to meet other club members. The club's monthly meetings are by far the worst way to get to know other club members since the meeting structure does not allow much in the way of conversation. The club's other activities, fly tying, casting, outings are all better venues. And it seems that the trout bouts are the premium meeting events.

Fly of the Month

The Gurgler and the Flip Flop Popper

With top water bassin' the topic of this month's program and Kelsey Bass Ranch the primer April outing, the FOM will focus on two proven top water patterns for bass.

Program presenter, Jerry Neuburger will demonstrate both patterns at the March FOM meeting scheduled for Wednesday, March 25th, 6:00 pm start time at the Oak Grove Park Nature Center.

The gurgler has been around for a long time and is a proven fly for many species from smallmouth to dorado and sailfish. As a plus, it's an easy tie and can be modified to resemble many topwater tasty bits from frogs to baby birds. A video of one of the variations of the gurger can be

Jerry will also show how to make flip flop poppers. These poppers resemble a traditional fly but make use of sandle foam for the bodies. They are quick to tie and are almost indestructible.

Because these flies are so easy to tie, the target for the evening will be two flies of each pattern with additional supplies for the quick tier.

These flies have proven successful on the Delta for smallmouth, largemouth and stripers and have also scored at Kelsey Bass Ranch.

Come on out for a fun evening. A \$5 fee will be charged for tying supplies. The session is closed and is only available to Delta Fly Fishers members.

Salmon in the Classroom, an opportunity for giving

This year 37 classrooms are involved in the Salmon in the Classroom (SITC) program, 19 of which are Delta Fly Fishersfunded tanks. These 37 classrooms represent about 810 students being exposed to the valley's fisheries and the obstacles faced.

DFF have been involved in SITCfor over 30 years with thousands of kids participating in this worth while effort. The club

tries to maintain a float of about \$2,000 to fund tanks annually. Right now, the balance is about \$1400. We are seeking additional donations of \$300 and will match that amount, bringing the total to \$2,000. DFF is a 501c3 tax exempt organization and any donation towards the program is tax deductable. Donations should be given to any DFF offocer, especially Dena Mason, chair of the SITC program.

About a dozen DFFers will give Pyramid Lake a try at the end of the month

Pyramid Lake is a mystical fishery with monster trout possible to those fishing the lake. Seven DFFers will stay at an Air BnB in Sparks for the last weekend of the month and be joined by about five others staying in separate facilities.

The current plan is for people to arrive at the lake through Friday, some arriving

> early and fishing during the day, and others driving up after work. Fishing will continue through Saturday with a group spaghetti dinner

planned for Saturday night.. Both those staying at the BnB and those with other accommodations are expected for the dinner.

Fishing will continue through Sunday with the group heading home, most around mid day.




