ACTION OF THE JUDGE ADVOCATE GENERAL

In the Special Court-Martial case of *United States v. First Lieutenant Mark C. Bashaw*, [REDACTED], Headquarters and Headquarters Company, U.S. Army Public Health Center, U.S. Army Medical Command, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland 21010, the accused's Application for Relief pursuant to Article 69, Uniform Code of Military Justice, the record of trial, the entirety of the Application for Relief, specifically to include the assignments of error, and all relevant documentation have been carefully reviewed.

I find that the applicant has not established a proper and specific basis for relief under one or more of the enumerated statutory grounds. Accordingly, the Application for Relief is denied.

Dear 1LT Bashaw,

This office completed the review of your application submitted pursuant to Article 69, Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ), concerning your Special Court-Martial. Based on this review, The Judge Advocate General, decided not to set aside the findings or sentence, in whole or in part, on the grounds stipulated in Article 69(c), UCMJ, or take other actions in your case.

In accordance with Article 69(d)(1)(B), UCMJ, you may apply to the Army Court of Criminal Appeals for review of the action taken by The Judge Advocate General in your case under Article 69(c), UCMJ. You must file your application no later than the earlier of (1) 60 days after the date on which you're notified of this decision or (2) 60 days after the date on which the decision is mailed to your address. The findings and sentence in your case will be final and conclusive under Article 76, UCMJ, if you do not apply, or the Army Court of Criminal Appeals rejects or takes no further action on your application.
