WELCOME FROM OUR CO-CHAIR



It gives me great pleasure to present the Co-Chairpersons report and I wish to begin by thanking the WAALI Board for their efforts and valuable contributions throughout the year. There have been many achievements for WAALI in its inaugural year. Firstly I would like to thank our founding partner, **Chevron Australia** for their support of the Yorga Djenna Bidi Women's Leadership Program. We thank Chevron for their belief in WAALI and the work we do and for the continued support both financially and pro bono of the Yorga Djenna Bidi Program and our organisation. I would also like to mention the pro bono support we have received from many incredibly talented and generous businesses and organisations including Jackson McDonald Lawyers, Glenn Longmire and Associates, Gerard Daniels and Committee for Perth. I would also like to acknowledge our inaugural CEO, Anjie Brook who joined the organisation in September and since that time has implemented many positive operational changes.

WAALI hit the ground running in its first year. We had 28 Aboriginal women graduate from our two **Yorga Djenna Bidi** programs. Those graduates increase the number of **Kwopertok Yorgas Alumni** to more than 70 in total. The Kwopertok Yorgas have held several training and development sessions throughout the year around being board ready and financial literacy. They continually engage with each other whilst still working on their own leadership development journey. WAALI received a generous grant to develop a pilot men's leadership program titled '**On Country Regeneration**' and we anticipate positive outcomes of this pilot. In celebration and honour of the National NAIDOC theme **Because of Her, We Can**, WAALI hosted a luncheon at Crown Perth with over 330 attendees of which the vast majority were Aboriginal women. The event was a great success and the program offered speaker panels with many topical issues discussed by and for Aboriginal women. Local duo, The Merindas performed along with Christine Anu, delivering brilliant entertainment on the day. Kirrikin Fashion showcased beautiful and unique local Aboriginal designed fashions and a parade that headlined the national model, Samantha Harris who walked the catwalk along with several of our local Aboriginal models including some of our Kwopertok Yorga Alumni. Gauging the attendance of the day and the feedback that was captured, the event was a great success!

I acknowledge and thank all our generous sponsors and supporters of the event.

In order for WAALI to continue to offer leadership opportunities to Aboriginal women and men, we **need your support**. The Yorga Djenna Bidi program has been a life changer for many of the participants who have offered this reflective feedback during and post the program. The impact of the program is very evident when we meet with Kwopertok Yorgas Alumni and hear about their post program achievements. They tell us about how they are so much more confident to speak up either at home, in the workplace or in the community and how they now have a toolkit of learnings from the program that they can tap into whenever required. It is empowering to see the positive exchanges that these women express during and post the Yorga Djenna Bidi Program. Not only are the women feeling a change in themselves but many are also working towards making a difference within their own families and communities. The underlying principal of why WAALI offers the leadership programs is evident in the lives it can change and how it can assist Aboriginal people, families and communities to overcome disadvantage. We would also like to offer these same opportunities to our men and young people within our community. I ask you to consider the options that we can provide to you to support WAALI in its journey to build capacity for Aboriginal people through leadership development. Finally, it has been an honour and a great pleasure to have served the organisation as a Co-Chair for the past year.

YORGA DJENNA BIDI ABORIGINAL WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Throughout 2018 two cohorts of inspirational Aboriginal women have completed the **Yorga Djenna Bidi Aboriginal Women's Leadership Program**. The Yorga Djenna Bidi Program



responds to the need for a leadership program that sensitively considers Aboriginal culture, history and community. It acknowledges that Aboriginal people are walking between two worlds - the Western and Aboriginal - each having their own set of rules and expectations. The program is delivered over five months and is the only initiative we are aware of that brings

Aboriginal women together across different cultural backgrounds, ages, occupations, education and leadership experiences. This diversity allows participants to learn from each other as well as from key speakers and facilitators. It is a leadership program that has been developed by Aboriginal women for Aboriginal women.

The two cohorts of inspiring Aboriginal women appreciated the leadership learnings shared by Aboriginal elders and leaders including Aunty Liz Hayden, Milly Penny, Aunty Marie Taylor, Gail Beck and Krista Dunstan.

Program Evaluation from **Yorga Djenna Bidi Graduates** tells us that at graduation from the Program:

- ✓ 93% of Yorga Djenna Bidi graduates agree/strongly agree they are **confident contributing to discussions around leadership**.
- ✓ 93% of Yorga Djenna Bidi graduates agree/strongly agree that they have **developed leadership skills** as a result of the program.
- ✓ 93% of Yorga Djenna Bidi graduates agree/strongly agree they are **have increased their level of confidence about their ability to be an effective leader**
- ✓ 100% of Yorga Djenna Bidi graduates **highly rate the Program**.



In October, a Sense Sound Sandalwood Relaxation and Yarning Session was held at the Yorgas Nganning Building in the Botanical Gardens Kings Park. A glorious morning for everyone who attended and special acknowledgement and thanks to Richeeta and Robyn for leading the relaxation session - a sensory sensation! We finished the year with a Kwopertok Yorgas Alumni Christmas Party kindly hosted by Perpetual Trustees. It was a fantastic evening that saw many friendships refreshed and new connections made.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2019

YORGA DJENNA BIDI ABORIGINAL WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

In 2019, WAALI is pleased to continue the highly successful Yorga Djenna Bidi Aboriginal Women's Leadership Program which is planned to be facilitated twice during the year with a February and July cohort intake of around 20 participants.

MEN'S ON COUNTRY CULTURAL REGENERATION LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

WAALI is currently developing an on country leadership program for Nyoongar men and youth, which will be coordinated and facilitated by Nyoongar men commencing late 2018 and continuing in 2019. The aim of the project is a reintroduction to an on country learning experience led by recognised Nyoongar cultural statesmen and providing a regeneration of Nyoongar culture through the process of leadership by example.

YORGA DJENNA BIDI ELDERS' RETREAT

In 2019, the Yorga Djenna Bidi Elders' Retreat will be offered to our highly respected Senior/Elder women in the community who have supported the Yorga Djenna Bidi Aboriginal Women's Leadership Program. The retreat is planned to invite up to fifteen women Elders to engage in cultural, health and wellbeing activities.

KWOPERTOK YORGA ALUMNI

With over 70 Kwopertok Yorga Alumni there are exciting plans for 2019 to continue to offer leadership development opportunities for all our alumni. Plans are in development for family friendly get-togethers and cultural networking and yarning sessions.

GOVERNANCE TRAINING

Planning is underway with several governance training providers to develop and facilitate culturally appropriate governance training that will develop and strengthen the knowledge and skills of Aboriginal people who are currently or who aspire to join boards of management and community based committees.

FINANCIAL TRAINING

Collaborative planning has commenced to develop and facilitate culturally appropriate financial literacy training that will empower and support Aboriginal people in the management of their finances and also in current or future positions on boards of management and committees.

STRONG GOVERNANCE AND OPERATIONS


The WAALI Board will continue to develop and strengthen the governance of the organisation to ensure the highest standards of governance and accountability.

WAALI'S STRATEGIC PROGRAM DIRECTIONS


The diagram below presents the strategic leadership programs of the organisation which are guiding our strategic and operational planning and directions for 2019 and beyond.

Western Australian Aboriginal Leadership Institute Overall Income 2017-18




An audit of the 2017/18 financial year was completed by Nexia Australia in December 2018.


