Currently, so much is taking place: Adrian Bassim and the Pastoral Council are efficiently coordinating all the events in our parish. This is why Tony Chamoun, on behalf of the council, spoke at the end of Divine Liturgy several weeks ago. If you recall he has asked every family's cooperation by contributing \$50 per week. I am also hoping to establish a Hospitality Committee, an Altar Boys Group, a Women's Organization, Men's organization and an Ushers' Committee in 2025. These additions will help our Parish Family to work even better in many ways.
