For those of you who have registered, thank you! You will receive an email soon this week with agenda details, parking instructions and the like.



He flew several different types of fighters for over 25 years on a nearly 30 year active duty career that including staff duty testing new and foreign equipment to ensure our combat pilots have the best equipment our brilliant engineers and workers can dream up and build to defend America against all enemies.

Ted spent his last active tour of duty as vice wing commander of the 366th FW at Mountain Home Air Force Base. After retiring he moved back to Tucson for a little over a year before he took an AF contractor job in England for 41/2 years, returning to the US and Mountain Home because of the friends him and his family made here.
