## **Special Committees**

### Landscaping & Common Grounds Maintenance Committee

The landscaping and common grounds maintenance committee is responsible for maintaining all common ground areas owned by the HOA (excluding the lake) such as neighborhood entrances, streets/roads, water access points, and the walking trail. Typical maintenance involves coordinating or assisting with mowing grass, weed eating, and/or planting shrubbery. Other responsibilities include scheduling and meeting with outside contractors for road repairs and/or landscaping ideas, securing bids, and providing proposals to the board of directors for consideration.

### Lake Maintenance Committee

The lake maintenance committee is responsible for all things lake-related for the preservation, conservation, and upkeep of the heart of our community (the lake). These efforts contribute to the preservation of the natural beauty of the lake and help us to maintain a healthy ecosystem. Other responsibilities include scheduling and meeting with outside contractors to discuss measures to protect the water quality, manage vegetation, preserve wildlife habitats, and promote sustainable practices within the community.

### **Architectural Review Committee**

The architectural committee is responsible for enforcing the community's architectural standards as it pertains to our Restrictive Covenants. This committee reviews the submitted building plans for new home construction, fences, piers, and docks and approves or denies them in accordance with specifics pertaining to single-family dwellings as outlined below from Book 2811, Page 419 of the 1981 Restrictive Covenants-Easement.

## **Question & Answer**

### How do I stay connected to community information and happenings?

### Which company provides trash pickup services?

or the Jernigan dump site is also an option if you prefer to haul your own trash located at 9221 Giles Road. Call 910-980-0563 for questions and/or hours.

### Can I burn my own trash in a barrel or in the yard?

No. Open burning is regulated by the North Carolina Environmental Quality and these regulations are enforced by the Cumberland County fire marshal and the local fire department. In general, open burning of yard debris is permissible unless a burn ban is in effect but burning of household trash is never allowed anywhere in the county under any circumstances. Violators can be fined up to \$25,000 or

#### Can I swim in the lake?

Yes, you can swim in the lake, but please be aware that lifeguards are not on duty (so take safety precautions, and don't swim alone) and you are swimming at your own risk. Any guests swimming or participating in water activities must be accompanied by a property owner at all times. Please reference the map on the "Info" page for common area locations and try to use Common Area #1 for swimming or water related activities.

#### If I don't own waterfront property, where can I swim?

The Toot Street common area has a flat beach and shallow water near the shore, and is generally considered an ideal swimming spot.

### Where can I launch a boat?

You can launch a boat at any of the three common areas. The launch sites are rudimentary, so please use with caution and leave room for others who may wish to launch while you are out.

### Can anyone fish on the lake?

Anyone fishing on the lake via land or boat must be accompanied by a property owner AT ALL TIMES. Giving permission to a family member, guest, or friend without property owner accompaniment is strictly forbidden. All residents are charged with asking questions of anyone that may be trespassing and encouraged to contact Cumberland County Sheriff's Office for any violators.

#### What kinds of fish live in the lake?

The most common species in Lake Teresa are largemouth largemouth bass, catfish, bream, crappie, warmouths, rock bass and minnows. The lake is stocked with grass carp every ten years to help control the algae and aquatic grasses, so we ask that you please not remove them from the lake. If you see them, please observe at a distance without disturbing.

### Are there any tagged fish in the lake?

Yes, in 2021 several tagged bass were placed in the lake (colored tag along dorsal fin) and we ask that you NOT REMOVE any bass with tags. If you catch one, quickly record the tag number and weight (if possible), release back into the lake, and then contact a board member to record the information.

### Are the train tracks active, and if so, how many times per day do they run?

Yes, the train tracks are active, and trains usually run a couple of times a day.

#### Who do I need to submit building plans to?

The Lake Teresa HOA Architectural Review Committee is responsible for reviewing building plans. The process is two phases with initial building schematics submitted followed by the plot plan (location of home on lot). Before any new construction commences, the plans must be approved.
