Insane jealousy, which has caused his wife to accuse him of buying clothing, rings and jewelry for a young woman, as well as of flirting with every girl who comes into his candy store in Norwood, is given as the basis of Clarence Kanis's suit for a divorce from Elizabeth Kanis. They were married in Norwood June 9, 1903. In November of last year Kanis opened the candy store, and he declares that ever since then his wife has made life unbearable for him by her constant quarreling and jealousy, and accusations of flirting with every girl who entered the store.

Last February Kanis claims his wife cut him with a knife, and in July last, he avers, she threatened to kill him and then commit suicide. On August 25 she threw a salt shaker at him and struck him on the head with it, then threw water on him. He declares that her actions were such that he had to give up the store on September 6 last.
