

Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, I am. Then took they up stones to cast at him: but Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple, going through the midst of them, and so passed by.

"For Jewish people **YHVH** is the most holy name of <u>God</u>, as written in the ancient <u>Hebrew</u> <u>language</u>. The written language showed no <u>vowels</u>, so the <u>pronunciation is not agreed on</u>. However, most academics agree that "Yahweh" is the most accepted way to say it.

It has also been pronounced as "Yehova" in Hebrew as a substitute word for the tetragrammaton. This is because Hebrew pointing, or vowel symbols, are often put under the YHVH, making יְהְוָה The vowels used come from the Hebrew word for Lord, "Adonai", which after the last captivity, was substituted and the vowels of "Adonai" forced into the tetragrammaton, incorrectly spelling God's Hebrew name as "YaHoVaH". It was never meant to be anything more than a substitute to avoid pronouncing the tetragrammaton.

Today, the three <u>Abrahamic</u> religions (<u>Judaism</u>, <u>Christianity</u> and <u>Islam</u>) say that there is only one God, defined in the Judeo/Christian Scriptures as Yahweh almost 7,000 times, with the general name "Elohim" a distant second at 2,500 times. Yahweh was spoken often by Jews. In the New Testament, Yahweh is also present with the expanded name of Yeshua (Jesus), meaning "Yahweh(Ye) Saves(shua).

Sometimes the four letters are called the Tetragrammaton, which is Greek for four letters

These four letters are usually JHWH in German, French and Dutch, and either YHWH, YHVH, JHWH or JHVH in English. In some English language Bibles, it is written in all capital letters as "LORD," as in Jewish tradition. Others, such as the **Jerusalem Bible use "Yahweh".** The Holman Christian Study Bible uses "**Yahweh**" when there is a reference to his name; God's Word Translation uses all of the Hebrew transliterations for the name of God.

The name **Jehovah** is used by the religious organization of <u>Jehovah's Witnesses</u> based on early English Bible translations repeated by the KJV.



In 2008, the Vatican reiterated a directive that the full name YAHWEH should not be used in Catholic liturgy out of respect for the **Jews who never pronounce the full word and YHWH** was to be used instead.^{[2]"} https://simple.m.wikipedia.org/wiki/YHWH

The name "Jehovah" never existed before, not in any language texture or rendering. In a simple word, it came out of transliteration, it didn't develop as a word or name in any language just as most words we use today came to be. It was intentionally a transliteration of **YHWH**. The direct **English translation of YHWH is not Jehovah but "I AM".** Jehovah is not found in the ancient Hebrew Bible, it is not found in the ancient Greek translation, neither was it found in the first and foremost Latin Vulgate translation of the Bible. The usage of it was extremely very rare in the Authorized English Bible, otherwise known as "King James Bible", it appeared only on seven occasions in the entire Bible. Many revisions of older bible versions has erased entirely "Jehovah" and replaced it with "Lord" or "YHWH", it includes but not limited to: New King James Version, Revised Standard Version, Good News Bible (Today's English Version), New American Standard Version and the rest. It will be recalled later in the article....Whereas, many also adopted Jehovah just to distinguish between God and other gods, it is not wise to do. In my personal opinion, God is God! He loves us and that is why He made His love and name known to us! **His name is I AM!**
