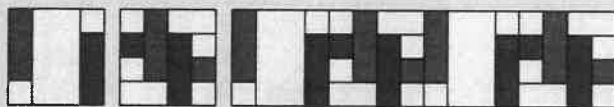


Clue 6. Block C: Assemble 9.

White Chicken Chili

We seem to always have a good turnout of quilt detectives during the winter months. Perhaps it's because everyone has a bit of cabin fever. Maybe it's just that they are ready to hang out with friends and eat good food! This will certainly fit the bill!

- 3 – 14 oz. cans Great Northern beans,
rinsed and drained
- 1 medium can creamed corn
- 1 small can chopped green chilies
- 1 medium can chicken broth
- 1 jar salsa, any size
- 1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 1 store-cooked rotisserie chicken, skinned,
boned, and shredded

Cook over medium heat on the stove top until heated through, or pour into slow cooker and cook all day on low. This serves 6 chilly sleuths.

***Clue 6** 1. Gather the remaining nine units 3 and 4 completed in clue 4, and nine $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " background bars. 2. Assemble nine blocks as shown. Pay close attention to the position of each unit. Make sure unit 3 is on the top, with the coordinate-A rectangle on the right. Make sure unit 4 is on the bottom, with the coordinate-B rectangle on the left. Press the seam allowances toward the background rectangle. This is block C.

***Clue 7** 1. Gather the 12 B blocks completed in clue 5 and twelve $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " feature squares. 2. Sew four rows with three B blocks and three feature squares. Alternate the squares with the blocks, beginning with a feature square and ending with a B block. Press the seam allowances toward the feature squares. This is row X.

***Clue 8** 1. Gather nine A blocks and nine C blocks. 2. Sew three rows as shown. Alternate the blocks, beginning with a C block and ending with an A block. Pay close attention to the positions of the blocks. The coordinate-A rectangles in the C blocks should be on the upper left. The coordinate-B square in the A blocks should be on the left. Press the seam allowances in the same direction. This is row Y.

***Clue 9** 1. Lay out X and Y rows, alternating the rows, beginning and ending with an X row. Sew the rows together and press well. 2. Examine the solutions on pages 62–91 to find the quilt photo and assembly diagram that match your completed quilt top. Add the borders and finish your quilt as described in your quilt's solution page.
