Guidelines:

☐ Use quilt shop quality 100% cotton fabrics, colors will be specified in instructions.
☐ Press blocks carefully as you construct them.
☐ Trim units/blocks to sizes indicated on instructions.
☐ Sign your name in permanent marker in the seam allowance.
☐ Bring completed blocks to monthly meetings OR drop blocks off at American Ribbon in
the fabric department- please place in Ziploc bag and label "QOV" OR mail to Laura
Lyman, PO Box 506, Pocono Lake, PA 18347

If you would like to donate backing fabric- 5 yards of a quilt shop quality 100% cotton fabric in a patriotic print it will be appreciated. If you would be willing to bind a quilt, please let Laura know- I will arrange to get a completed quilt to you when needed.

Challenge 2023: "Quilt Magazine Challenge"

All interested members will be given a random quilt magazine provided by Kathy Parrish. The member will turn to page 18 of their magazine and find something on that page which inspires them. It does not have to be a quilt pattern on the page; maybe a color or a theme or part of a pattern-just something which gets your creative juices flowing. If your page 18 is a true dud (and there were a few) you can change to a different magazine. Make a project no larger than 36" on each side. Projects will be displayed at the August picnic. There will be a viewer's choice award for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners. Good Luck everyone!

Striped Fabric Workshop: February 11th (9:00 to 3:00pm)

We will have a sign-up sheet at January's meeting.

If you plan to attend the workshop, decide which type of top you want to make and bring yardage required, along with any border fabric you want to use, if any. You will need a sewing machine, also bring your cutting and sewing supplies.

Lorraine's idea from Missouri Star is to use 1 ¼ yard of striped fabric which will make the center of a quilt top approximately 35" square, you'll need additional border fabric to coordinate with the center. Double the amount of fabric to make a bigger quilt.

Barb's idea from Jordan Fabrics is to use 1 2/3 yard of striped fabric which will make 24 blocks to make the center of a quilt top approximately 36" x 54" (throw size). **Or** use 1 yard of striped fabric which will make 12 blocks to make the center of a quilt top approximately 30" x 40" (baby quilt size) (not including borders for either). Jordan Fabrics tutorial used fabric with striated streaks of variegated colors.
