## Minutes: General Meeting: 02/04/2015

The meeting was brought to order at 6.45pm by Vice President Jane Maughan, 18 members were present and two guests, Ann Lesh and Shirley Correll. Jane Maughan briefly talked about the program for the evening. We would be watching several tutorials on binding. Jane stated that this was chosen because if we had to cancel, it would be easy to do so. Let's have a discussion after the videos and then we can share ideas. Jane found the videos on YouTube and professed that YouTube was a great site to find things.

Discussion followed the videos and Jane said she would send out the link to the videos. Refreshments followed.

At 7.50pm President Lois Kirkwood called the meeting to order.

**Treasurer's Report:** A motion was called for to accept the Treasurer's report as printed in the newsletter. A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was accepted by Marianne Bridges and seconded by Donna Conto. All members were in favor

**Secretary:** No minutes were taken in January, as we did not have a meeting.

**Activities:** Vice President Jane Maughan spoke about the challenge. She asked for a show of hands to see how many members were doing the challenge. Jane was pleased to see that so many members were doing a challenge piece. NQA judge Phyllis Manley will be judging the challenge with a member from the Bar Association and a member of the Pocono Arts Council; it will be a three panel system. Jane is making a quilt but it will not be judged. The newsletter does list the drop off points; no late entries will be accepted. You may also drop off your quilt at Jane's office.

The opening to present the challenge will be a cocktail party on March 6<sup>th</sup>. A viewer's choice will be voted on that evening and then the show will move to the Arts Council gallery for two weeks. The judging will take place on February 28<sup>th</sup>. There will be a catalog for the show; there will be a photograph of the quilt and a description. The winning quilt will be on the cover of the catalog. If you are not entering the challenge, you are still welcome to come to the cocktail party. The Historical Society would like the guild to make a quilt from the courthouse fabric for them.

**March:** Earn you PHD (Pretty Much Half Done) over the spring and summer. Bring in a UFO, sign a contract and hopefully bring the piece back to the August picnic completed.

**April:** We will be sewing by hand and this would be a great way to learn this technique. There will be a kit for sale for \$5.00 which includes three fat quarters, plus the paper piecing pattern. You will have to sign up at the March meeting for the kit.

**Ways and Means:** Raised \$22.00. Members who won items were Ellen Stanley, Kim Kimler, Donna Conto, Andrea Kash and Barbara Wenton.

**Hospitality:** was provided by Sheryl Flatt, Ellen Stanley, Marianne Bridges, Linda Doll, and Christine Bearn. Thank you to all members who brought things in to share.

**Old Business:** Lois Kirkwood brought up the fact that we are paid up until the end of

May for the storage unit. We will have to pay another \$600 plus for another year after that. Lois announced that she would like to hear from the members their thoughts about the frames. Does anyone have any ideas on how to use them?

**Marianne Bridges**.... Maybe other guilds could rent them from us.

**Barb Wenton**.... The quilt show decision was just for this year, should we wait to make this decision?

**Jane Maughan** ..... Believes that we will do a show again, but we may be doing something on a smaller scale.

**Peggy P. Chiniewicz** ... Do we have the opportunity to rent a smaller unit?

**Sarah Pierson**.... How do we propose to get rid of the pipes?

**Kathy Parrish** .... We are all getting older and are getting too old to put them up.

**Pat Bruck** ... There are sites on line that will advertise things for sale locally.

**Lois Kirkwood** ... We cannot think of the quilt show on the same scale. A lot of our quilter's do not even make quilts. We have certainly got our moneys worth out of the pipes.

**Barbara Hall** made a motion to dispose of the pipes and the wood that are in the storage unit, in whatever manner we can. **Pat Bruck** seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

**New Business:** Lois Kirkwood read a letter to guild from a lady that was offering fabric to a good home.

The meeting was adjourned by Barb Wenton.

## **April Meeting: Paper Piecing Supply list**

Your purchased \$5 kit will include paper foundations for three 5" blocks and 3 fat quarters of the fabric.

We will need small irons, groups of four can share irons, and guild will not be supplying irons for this project.

### **Please bring:**

1. Needles of your choice for hand sewing. Using a slightly larger than normal needle can be helpful in removing the paper as larger needles put bigger holes in the paper.
2. Pins
3. Small scissors and/or rotary cutter
4. Small rotary cutting mat
5. A postcard or index card 5" long or slightly larger
6. Marker to mark back of fabric, pencils are suitable
7. Medium to light tone neutral sewing thread for sewing seams (grey or tan is best)
8. Small ruler
9. Iron
10. Small paper bag for your scraps (Guild will provide painter's tape to attach bags to the tables).

### **Optional items:**

Needle threader, thimble, the Add A Quarter yellow ruler is helpful but not necessary.
