### Minutes: 02/10/2016

Lois Kirkwood and Marie Guidry introduced a guest, Leslie Perryman, who is the resource representative for "Streets to Feet". Donations which were collected at the annual Christmas Party through our tricky tray totaled \$400 which was presented as a check to Leslie for her organization.

The program for the evening was a U-Tube Video "Making Totes" by Missouri Star Quilt Co. for a quilt as you go tote bag project.

The meeting was called to order by Lois Kirkwood. A motion was made to accept the minutes from the January meeting as printed in the newsletter by Jan McBeth and seconded by Christine Bearn. Correction was added to reflect that Marie Guidry made the arrangements to contact a representative from "Street to Feet". Secretaries' minutes were approved with the correction.

The treasurer's report indicated there was no activity. Motion to accept by Barb Wenton and seconded by Lorraine Hare. All approved.

Committee to explore generating guild revenue chairperson, Christine Bearn gave a report. The committee met with 11 members attending. The mood was positive and energetic. The goal was to develop one idea to raise funds and the group is now looking at two ideas. The goal is to cover the annual operating costs for the Guild which is estimated to be \$3000-4000 a year. The first idea discussed was quilt bingo. It was thought that spring was a better time to hold this activity as there are many fall programs from other sources. There were several possible venue sites. The Moose Lodge in Stroudsburg can hold 130 people and would have no fees for the guild to use. There would be 16 Bingo games, all of which would require a prize. The Guild would be looking for members to donate the prizes which should have a value of \$30 or more each. We would also have food for sale- salads, breads, etc. We could also have a tricky tray during the Bingo to raise additional funds. The second fund raising idea being considered by the committee is for a calendar featuring quilts that are displayed by volunteer young muscular men. The general idea is to keep the calendar fun, wholesome and in good taste. This idea would still need a lot investigation into the feasibility. The target audience for both projects is not necessarily quilters. The committee also discussed the quilt raffle. There was a suggestion to use the Sue Bonnet Sue quilt but the members were concerned that it would not have a broad appeal. Christine did have a plan for a raffle quilt using the pattern "Braid Quilt". She had five packets made up for volunteers tonight. Christine asked the members if they wanted to pursue the Quilt Bingo. All members were in favor. The Moose Lodge has a license and a caller. The Bingo would be held on a weekend, possibly a Sunday. The next date for the committee to meet was set for 2/16/16 at 6:00pm

Lois asked each Guild Committee Chairperson if there was a report. Activities- UFO's are due at the March meeting. The Challenge is due also at the March meeting and will be displayed at the April meeting. Ways and Means collected \$28 tonight. Challenge 2016 must be turned in to Lorraine by Wednesday March 16<sup>th</sup>.

Marie Guidry informed the Guild that she did purchase a book in memory of Uranus Kirkwood which is already available at the library- "Facts and Fabrications-Unraveling the History of Quilts and Slavery".

There was one guest at tonight's meeting- Ranelle Hazelton.

Lorraine informed the members that she had a request from Jackie Hazen, who had been a member in the past, to rent 45 pieces of our quilt show muslin for her guild to use to display quilts. After discussion the members agreed to loan Jackie the muslin with a deposit to ensure the muslin is returned and in good shape.

Meeting was adjourned.

Please follow guidelines for submitting your quilt.

**Program:** ScrapStashtic Quilts: A lecture on Organizing and ACTUALLY using your fabric scraps Janellea Macbeth presents the concepts from her book, *ScrapStashtic Quilts*, in a lively and educational lecture that will change the way you view your quilting scraps. During the lecture, Jan will teach your audience the value of scrap quilting, her favorite system of slicing, storing, and using your fabric scraps, and ways to adapt her system to meet the individual needs of any quilter. Quilt examples for show and tell are included.

This system is for the creative quilter who knows and appreciates the value of every inch of fabric, but values the organization and order of their sewing room even more. The lecture will educate and entertain quilters of all ability levels. ScrapStashtic Quilts is a complete scrap quilting system based on over 30 years of sewing experience and 20 years of productivity and time management study. Janellea will present easy to follow steps that will increase your quilting creativity, clean up your sewing space, keep your fabric stash fresh and inspiring, and help you reduce your quilting carbon footprint.

**April 13<sup>th</sup>:** The challenge quilts will be presented to guild and ribbons awarded.


