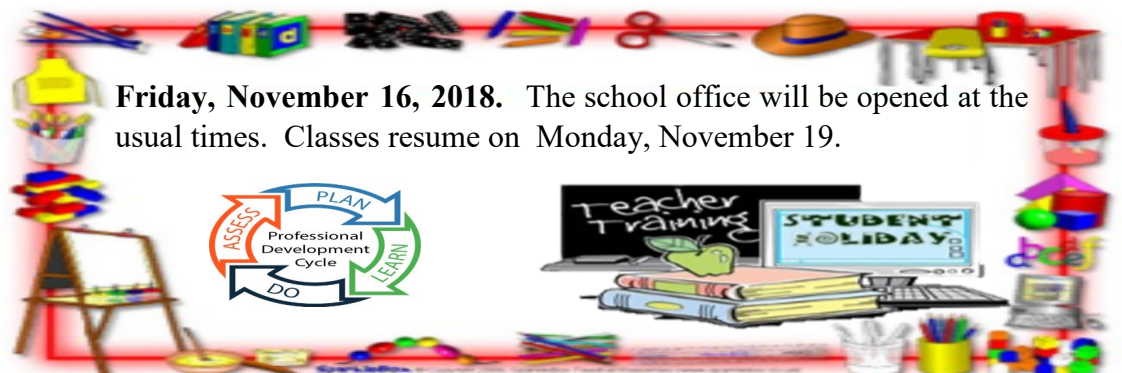

DISPLACED STUDENTS

There were students enrolled in Moravian School in the immediate aftermath of Hurricanes Irma and Maria. These students were assumed to be displaced by the storms. The Department of Education received federal funds to cover the cost that the parents of such students incurred because of the storms. Parents of qualified students (Grades K—8th) will in the near future be reimbursed the tuition paid during the last academic year. Those parents will be notified accordingly. Again please note that this is only for qualified students. The disbursement is being done under the funds and the guidelines provided by the Federal Government.



Parents/Guardians have the option of PayPal to make tuition payments. This is convenience that has a service charge of 3% on any transaction you make. This 3% charge must be taken into account in choosing this option. The cost and benefit analysis may lead to the conclusion that the convenience is worth it or that 3% service charge may be better than a \$50.00 late fee. Of course, all such online payments must be made by the 10th of each month that the tuition becomes due. If not you may have both charges added to your account.
