Subject: Open Records Request

Under the Oklahoma Open Records Act, I, Christopher J. Barnett hereby request a full and complete list of all licensed growers, processors and dispensaries as well as the addresses, owners names and phone numbers for all growers, dispensaries, and processors who have been licensed by the State of Oklahoma.

It is my understanding that the OMMA has removed this information from its website, violating the Oklahoma Open Records Act. I request that the OMMA restore this information to the OMMA website as it is public record and the OMMA

has no authority to censor or keep this information from the public, even citing safety concerns. For example, liquor stores have been robbed in Oklahoma, and even people working at liquor stores have been killed, but liquor store information, as well as the owners name is available to the public.

OMMA must provide all information and cannot censor or shield it.

I request that OMMA restore this access to the public no later than close of business on Monday November 19, 2018 or I will bring suit for the OMMA intentionally violating the Oklahoma Open Records Act, seek an emergency injunction and restraining order and have the court order OMMA to restore the information as the public has the right to know. OMMA cannot with hold information simply because people don't want it to be public. This is what Government transparency looks like.

Please provide the information requested and please consult with your legal counsel. OMMA cannot keep this information private or only provide part of it.
