Mr. Oakley

It was great speaking with you today. I wanted to take a moment and send you a copy of our conversation from earlier. I record all phone calls.

At this point, I am now demanding all emails as requested. I plan to file a lawsuit against The City of Bixby and Bixby Police Department so we can have a Judge review emails you claim an exemption applies to. As you admitted, both you and the police chief communicate a lot of personal information, however that doesn't mean that attorney client privilege applies to everything. I feel that you and the police chief are covering something up and if you are, I urge you to come clean. We will find out. When you use a public server to send or receive emails, you have zero expectation to privacy. Tax payers have every right to this information.

You have no business asking why I want the emails. The public has the right to view these emails and the law is clear that you have no right to ask me why I want access to them.

I urge you to familiarize yourself with the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

Please let me know when all emails for the Bixby Police Chief will be available for pickup and review. If you with hold any records, we will be asking the Judge to review all records and then make a determination as to what is and is not privileged.

I will be posting a copy of our phone call today on www.oklahomansfortransparency.com sometime in the next 24 hours as well as all communications.
