To whom it may concern:

I, Christopher J. Barnett, President of Transparency for Oklahomans, a public interest watch dog group hereby make the following open records request to Bixby Police Department:

Please provide all dash cam videos or recordings from your officers that responded to a call at 7909 E 148<sup>th</sup> Street, Bixby Oklahoma 74008 around 1:30 am on 12/07/2018. I am told that your officers demanded entry to the building with no probable cause. There were no signs of any break-ins at the building, the alarm did not go off and the security office present would not allow entry. I am told that both racial and homophobic remarks were made by the Bixby Police officers who responded to this call.

Please provide the names of all Bixby Police officers that responded to the call on 12/07/2018 around 1:30 am at 7909 E 148<sup>th</sup> Street South, Bixby Oklahoma 74008.

Please provide all radio recordings for 12/06/2018 to 12/07/2018 with a starting time on 12/06/2018 of 11pm to the next day on 12/07/2018 to 2 am.

Please provide all dash cam recordings for all responding officers that responded to 7909 E 148<sup>th</sup> Street S, Bixby Oklahoma 74008 on 12/07/2018 around 1:30. Please provide the videos in their entirety.

Please provide any text messages from any of the responding officers that may have text other officers regarding police business between 12/06/2018 to 12/07/2018.

Please provide any communications from Scott Mabrey or Mabrey Bank to the Bixby Police Chief or The Bixby Police department between 12/01/2018 to current. When I spoke with heather, the open records custodian, she asked if my call was in reference to the bank which is very interesting.

Please provide any e-mails or text messages from Scott Mabrey or Mabrey Bank to the Bixby Police Chief or any Bixby Police officer for the time period starting 12/01/2018 to current.

Please provide why your officers were demanding entry to a building without probable cause and if a call was made, please provide a recording of the call so the public may hear it.

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This request is made in the interest of the public. No search fee shall apply as Oklahoma law provides if the request is in the interest of the public, then as stated, no search fee will apply.

We are investigating the matter for possible corruption, racketeering, federal civil rights violation and other matters. I'm very interested if Mabrey Bank had anything to do with the Bixby Police showing up to harass a licensed Medical Marijuana grow operation which is in full compliance of the law.

Full disclosure as I am an avid supporter of Transparency, I own the property and business the Bixby Police Department illegally harassed. I have called and left a message for the Bixby Police Chief requesting a meeting, however no call has been returned. My head of security, Ron Owens with First Strike Security has also requested the same.

It is requested that your provide all information as soon as possible.

In regards to text messages, if any Bixby Police Officers sent any text messages, even on their personal cell phones that have to do with Police Business or any police matter or calls, then it is subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

In regards to e-mails, any and all e-mails sent or received by the Bixby Police Department are subject to the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

Additionally, I request all emails to the Bixby Police Chief with a time period starting July 01, 2018 to current.

Please do a server wide search of all Bixby Police Servers and computers and search the name Scott Mabrey and please return all positive results.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me at 918-340-0517.

I will be sending this via email as well as Certified Mail. Please consult with the City Attorney. We do not play games when it comes to the Oklahoma Open Records Act or the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act. If you fail to comply with the law, or delay access, we will respond swiftly with a lawsuit against the Bixby Police Department.

I look forward to your response.
