Mission Statement

"Trauma redemption through the healing power of animal therapy"

Our mission:

The mission of Redemption Ranch is to provide animalassisted trauma therapy programs to people who have experienced
debilitating trauma, including veterans and first responders with
post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)/traumatic brain injury
(TBI)/military sexual trauma (MST), their families, individuals
who have experienced abuse or other traumatizing event, and those
recovering from addiction, depression, or loss. Individuals needing
more personalized, long-term animal assistance may qualify for a
service dog through Redemption Ranch's service dog training
program. Animals used in these programs consist of former shelter
Pit Bull type dogs and BLM mustang horses. Animals in our
programs serve a wide range of needs, from emotional
support/companions to therapy animals to highly trained PTSD
service animals, with the ultimate goal of redeeming both human and
animal.

Guidelines for Working with Redemption Ranch Animals

We require all team members to abide by the following guidelines to ensure your safety and the safety of the animals:

Do not attempt to handle any animal unless you have been given express permission to do so by your supervisor. Handle animals as directed at all times. Always remember that some of these animals have unknown pasts that can negatively influence their reactions to novel people and situations.

Allow animals to approach you upon first meeting, especially when an animal is in its kennel or pen. Always think "calm" when approaching and/or working with an animal.

Familiarize yourself with each animal's unique needs and personality, and with animal body language in general, before attempting to interact with an individual animal.

Honor <u>all</u> directives given by the senior team member overseeing your volunteer work, especially as those directives pertain to caring for specific animals as well as engaging with multiple animals at once. This is <u>extremely important</u> to ensure the safety of handlers and animals at all times.



Team Expectations

As REDEMPTION RANCH is founded on Christ-Centered principles, and while volunteers are not expected to share this faith, we expect all team members to represent our organization with the utmost respect:

We speak to each team member with kindness and due respect for the other person's value as a human being.

We demonstrate our organization's loving compassion for humans as well as animals by speaking (<u>verbally or online</u>) and acting with kindness toward both humans and animals alike, even and especially when we disagree with or dislike someone else's words or behavior.

We honor authority structures within the organization, as well as while living our lives in public, by submitting maturely to advice, redirection, and discipline.

We seek to retain or reconcile relationship bonds with others inside and outside of our organization by offering correction with guidance, and by acknowledging with humility those times when we make mistakes.
