



SAT-7

Dr. Rex Rogers, President of SAT-7 USA reports that millions in Afghanistan are



fearful of the radical advance of the Taliban, which is actively looking for believers, seen as an evil that must be purged from the nation. Viewers share their fears and ask for comfort. For many, their only connection with other Christians is by phone or texting the

SAT-7 counselors and by watching the programs. Under Taliban control, electrical power has been curtailed, one of their many efforts to put a clamp on contact with the outside. Power is available in the cities typically for only two hours in the evening--when people can turn on televisions, watch SAT-7, charge their phones, and call the SAT-7 follow-up team of counselors, even if it is at great risk to themselves. According to the director of SAT-7 PARS, "Responses to the programs have grown tremendously in the last two years from Afghanistan. Now, with the Taliban advancing, SAT-7 PARS is one of the last resources that isolated Christians have to be at their side, comfort them, disciple them, and share the Good News of salvation. Most dare not attend a house church. For many, we are their last resort. SAT-7, and a few partner agencies, with whom we work in the background, have remained to minister." Prayer requests include: "That the Lord will give the producers, staff and follow-up counselors strength and wisdom to create programs most relevant and helpful to the isolated believers." "For viewers' protection. Many of them are in grave danger of being betrayed."



Basil Day Visits LMC Church

 - \$3,000.00 to PDA for Tennessee relief with \$2,350.00 taken from the Mission Endowment Fund and \$650.00 from MOM-Line 6339 Mission's Discretionary Outreach
 - \$3,000.00 to PDA for Hurricane Ida relief with \$3,000.00 coming from the Mission Endowment Fund.
 - These funds will be given in addition to the contributions collected from the congregation. Thank you for helping to bless these missions around the world!
 - □ Themed food bags were purchased and distributed to the Fairfield Food Pantry in the middle of September. Funds collected over the summer were used for this mission.
