C1 214 A118/X1 Joseph Culbertson B3/12/1816 D8/15/1884. Son of Hugh II 1792-3/29/1876(C2 236;A123) and Sarah 1795-3/29/1836(C2 237;A124).married 1815 Married Mary Ann (White) B1/15/1824 D1/14/1893. (C1 214;A118 also). Daughter of Thomas White,Jr (1796-1832)and Margaret McClellan (1794-1850).They had 7 children: Washington Scott (1847-?): Sarah Margaret. (1851 8/18/1860); Joseph,Jr (1854-?),Samuel E. B1857(6) D8/30/1860. Mary Elizabeth (-), John W. (1862-?).

C2 233 A120/XI Arabella J.Culbertson B1845 D9/12/1865. Daughter of Hugh (C2 236;A123) and Jane (McClellan)

C2 234 A121/XI Susan Culbertson B1838 D8/8/1859. Daughter of Hugh (C2 236;A123) and Jane (McClellan).

C2 235 A122/XI John M. Culbertson B1825 D6/21/1855. Son of Hugh (C2 236;A123) and Sarah (C2 237;A124)(

C2 236 A123/XI Hugh Culbertson II B7/12/1792 D3/2. Had two wives; Sarah (C2 237;A124) and Jane (McClellan). Son born to Hugh and Sarah, John McClellan Culbertson (1825-6/21/1855. Three children by Hugh and Jane Samuel, Sara and Arabella. Jane's burial unknown. She was daughter of Thomas McClellan 9/1876.

C2 237 A124/XI Sarah (Witherow) Culbertson. B1795 D3/29/1836. First wife of Hugh (C2 236;A123). They had sons Joseph (C1 215;A118) and John (C2 235;A122).

D2 346 A132/XI Sarah (Culbertson) Blythe D8/15/1896. Married 3/21/1837 to Washington Blythe. Daughter Sarah L. D2/10/1901 D2 347;A132.

C2 238 A133/XII Clayton Chamberlain B2/2/1760 D2/28/1819. Two daughters:

Eleanor married 12/21/1808 to George McGlaughlin; Maria married in 1822 to John Zimmerman. Both married by Rev Paxton.

#### **NOTES**

James D. Paxton, son of William Paxton was married 3/18/1819 to Maria Miller, daughter of Capt William Miller and Margaret (Craig) Miller. (She is the Maggie Miller on the sign at the Fairfield Inn and daughter of Thomas Craig and Jane (Jamison). James was co-owner with Thaddeus Stevens of Maria Furnace Iron Works on Ironsprings Rd, Fairfield. James' burial may be in Evergreen with Capt Miller. James' son, William B1824 became a professor at Princeton University.

From Records in Tom's Creek Church and Piney Creek Church in Harney, MD.

Rev. Dr. William Paxton, one of the early ministers of Tom's Creek Presbyterian Church, lived at Millerstown, now Fairfield. and from that point ministered for a time to 3 churches, Piney Creek, Marsh Creek and Tom's Creek. He was a native of Chester Level, Lancaster Co., PA, was interred at Lower Marsh Creek cemetery. Stone inscribed: "In memory of Wm Paxton, died Sept 21, 1853, minister Piney Creek Church, Harney, MD. Aged 62 years. In 1817 a record of the old Sessions book gives names of parish who contributed to his salary.

Rev. Robert Smith Grier was pastor also of Tom's Creek and Piney Creek churches for 52 years.
