BRIEF HISTORY

The Woodville District Basketball Club (WDBC) was formed in March 1980 by members of the Cheltenham Basketball Club. At that time, Cheltenham was playing in a community competition at the St. Clair Stadium, and their members wanted to play at the highest possible level. To accomplish this, they needed to enter the District Competition.

Initially, Woodville entered teams in the senior men's and women's competitions, along with three teams in the juniors. During 1982, Woodville successfully challenged the bottom teams in the Division 1 men's and women's competition for the right to play at the highest level in the state. In 1983, Woodville was granted full membership of the Basketball Association of South Australia.

1. TRIALLING FOR THE WARRIORS

Current Woodville players will be advised of the selection process once external trials are completed. Current financial Woodville players will be given a position in a team.

If you have an outstanding fee from previous seasons, you will not be able to trial or be selected for a squad or team.

All players, existing and new, must complete the online Intent to Play form. This form will be used to cater for trial numbers and timings. Players will not be permitted to trial if they have not completed this form.

THIS PAYMENT IS NON-REFUNDABLE even if you later decide to not play for WDBC. (Refunds will be provided if you are not **selected** in the team).

Once team selection is completed, you will be emailed a Notification of Team Selection and Code of Conduct Acceptance, where a non-refundable \$80 fee, which will go towards your membership fees, will be required.

2. CLEARANCES

Players who are not in good financial standing with WDBC will not be granted a clearance. Clearances will not be granted until all outstanding fees have been paid in full.

Clearance requests will attract a \$50 administration fee for Junior and Senior players, and \$200 for NBL1, at the club's discretion.

Clearance requests must be sent in writing to secretary@woodvillewarriors.com.au, stating the player's name as well as the club to which the player is requesting a clearance.

4. WHEN DO WE TRAIN?

All teams train twice a week — once on a weeknight and once on Sunday. Training venues include, but are not limited to: St Clair Recreation Centre, St Michael's Junior Primary, Whitefriars Catholic School, Seaton High School, and 36ers Arena.

Venues and times will be advised once teams have been finalised.

5. WHAT SIZE BALL DO I NEED?

Players require a ball for practice and come in different sizes, which are used by different age groups.

- Under 10 and U12 grades (boys and girls) use a **size 5** (69.9cm -27 inch) basketball
- Under 14 grades (boys and girls) use a **size 6** or (72.5cm - 29 inch) basketball
- Girls/Women: Under 16, 18, Youth League & Senior Women's grades use a size 6 (72.5cm - 29 inch) basketball
- Boys/Men: Under 16, 18, YL and Seni or Men's grades use a size 7 (75cm - 30 inch) basketball.



6. WHERE DO I GET MY WOODVILLE GEAR?

Numbers are allocated to new players by the Club. Numbers must be allocated prior to uniforms being ordered. Woodville District Basketball Club applies the ruling of even birth years correspond to even numbers and odd birth years correspond to odd numbers based on your birth year. This process helps avoid players in the same age group being allocated the same number.

Contact merch@woodvillewarriors.com.au for the allocation of player numbers, providing the player's full name, age group (e.g., Under 16 boys, Under 12 girls), and date of birth. You can request up to three preferences; however, these are not guaranteed. A number will be provided within a reasonable timeframe.

Once a player number has been allocated, uniforms can be purchased from **Sports Centre through their website or in store at 749 Port Road, Woodville South.**

All players are required to purchase a green and gold reversible playing singlet, black and silver reversible training singlet, along with playing shorts. The gold singlets will be worn for specific clash games.

If you are having difficulties getting a uniform before the first game, please contact Sports Centre, they hold loan uniforms

Other club apparel such as Warm up tops, hoodies, tracksuits, bags, socks etc. is also available. Most items will be ready dependent on stock levels when you visit the store.

Warm up tops are sublimated as per the uniforms. A player's last name (only) can be placed on the back of the warmup top. If there is more than one player per family, then the players first initial can be added to the last name. Please note first names and nicknames will not be placed on the back of the warmup tops.

9. WHEN ARE THE SEASONS?

A typical year in junior and youth district basketball includes:

- **Grading Season** – This is the start of the basketball season. Games run from **October to December**. This is typically a chance for the club to regrade teams and make changes to teams in divisions. Training for the grading season will commence in early September.
- **Championship season** – This is the major season in the basketball calendar. Games run from early **February until August/September**.
- **State Championships** – These are held in **May** with all 10 member clubs competing in **Division 1 and 2**. Each team competes for the overall Boys Club, Girls Club and Combined Club Awards. Woodville District Basketball Club expect that if you are selected in a Division 1 or 2 team you will compete in these Championships. **The cost for this tournament is included in Division 1 and 2's fees and will be charged separately to registration fees.**

12. UNIFORM POLICY

Game Day

Players are required to always be in full playing uniform when on the court or on the bench. This includes during warm-up. Playing uniform, warm-up top, hoodie, etc. Players are not to wear other club merch to games; this includes social club merch.

Junior Participation Zero Tolerance Policy

PURPOSE

To provide participants with a healthy, safe and developmental athletic environment that encourages fair play, effort, teamwork and sportsmanship. Woodville District Basketball Club (WDBC) supports a Zero Tolerance Policy for players, parents, coaches, game officials, umpires, team officials, league administrators and spectators.

This policy requires that a sportsmanlike and developmentally positive atmosphere exist before, during and after all Woodville District Basketball Club Juniors sanctioned events.

POLICY

All WDBC players, coaches, team officials, administrators, and parents are expected to always conduct themselves in a respectful and sportsmanlike manner before, during, and after WDBC sanctioned events. Good conduct is expected to extend to referees, game officials, spectators, as well as to opposing players, coaches, and parents.

PLAYERS

A penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct (Zero Tolerance) shall be assessed whenever a player:

- Openly disputes or argues any decision by an official.
- Uses obscene or vulgar language and/or gestures at any time, including any swearing, even if it is not directed at a particular person.

- Visually displays any sign of dissatisfaction with an official's decision with the intent to incite the officials, players, or spectators. Any time that a coach persists in any of these actions, they shall be assessed a game misconduct penalty.

OFFICIALS

Officials are required to conduct themselves in a businesslike, sportsmanlike, impartial and constructive manner. The actions of an official must be above reproach. Actions such as "baiting" or inciting players or coaches are strictly prohibited. Officials are ambassadors of the game and must always conduct themselves with this responsibility in mind.

PARENTS/SPECTATORS

Parents and spectators are required to conduct themselves in a manner that is conducive to the safety and development of all players.

- Use of obscene or vulgar language and or gestures in a boisterous manner to anyone at any time.
- Taunting of players, coaches, officials or other spectators by means of baiting, ridiculing, threat of physical violence or physical violence.
