Tennis Courts Update

The Board has approved work on upgrading the tennis/pickleball courts. This will include resurfacing, repairing, patching, painting and relining the tennis courts and installation of a new 10 ft. tall black chain-link fence and gates around the tennis courts. Work will take place this year.



Highlights of Thornberry Board Meeting – June 18, 2026

- The Board approved the purchase of a new gator for Maintenance.
- Phyllis Spicer was elected to the Board to fill an opening.
- The Garden Committee has ordered flowers for the Beautification project.
- Pool chairs have been power washed, and we will look into power washing some sidewalks.
- Oleander has begun tree trimming and will return in the Fall to do more. Any tree that is removed will be replaced.
- A paving schedule will be sent out to those getting new driveways.
- Robinson Township put a camera under the ground near the pool, and they believe there is a leak in a pipe 20 ft. down. We will have an engineer come in to inspect it at no cost to us.
- The Board is researching outside storm/screen doors for any homeowner who would like to purchase one for their residence. Pittsburgh Window & Door Company would install them and paint them to match your inside door. Watch for more details.

Easy Summer Recipes

Red, White & Blue Pie – Taste of Home

- 9" graham cracker crust
- 2 oz. white baking chocolate, melted
- ¾ cup sliced strawberries
- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- ¾ cup confectioners' sugar
- ¾ cup 2% milk
- 3.3 oz. instant white chocolate pudding mx
- 1 cup whipped topping
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 8 fresh strawberries, halved lengthwise



Directions

1. Spread melted white chocolate on bottom and sides of crust. Arrange sliced strawberries over chocolate.
2. Beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Gradually beat in milk. Add pudding mix. Beat on low speed until thickened, about 2 mins. Spread over strawberries.
3. Decorate pie with whipped topping, blueberries and strawberries.
4. Refrigerate until serving.

Pinwheels – Taste of Home

- 8 oz cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup cheddar cheese
- 1 cup sour cream
- 4.25 can chopped ripe olives
- 4 oz. can chopped green chilies, drained
- ½ cup chopped green onions
- Garlic powder to taste
- Seasoned salt to taste
- 5 flour tortillas – 10", warmed
- Salsa for dipping (optional)



Directions:

1. Beat cream cheese, cheddar & sour cream. Stir in olives, chiles, green onions & seasonings.
2. Spread onto tortillas and wrap each tightly in plastic wrap. Refrigerate several hours.
3. Unwrap & cut into ½ slices using a serrated knife. Serve with salsa.
