Heart Transplant Services by Coordinator Emily Wacker: Essential Guidelines for Post-Transplant Care

Emily Wacker, a dedicated transplant coordinator, emphasizes the importance of consistent follow-up and care after a heart transplant to ensure long-term health and success. Here are key guidelines for heart transplant recipients to follow:

1.Lab Work: After a heart transplant, it's essential to have lab work done every three months to monitor your health and the function of your transplant. If you've also had a kidney transplant, it's important to get labs done monthly for your kidney team as well.

2.Skin Cancer Screening: Regular check-ups with a dermatologist are crucial. Emily recommends an annual skin cancer screening to detect any potential issues early, as transplant patients may be more susceptible to skin cancers.

3.Primary Care: Keeping up with your primary care doctor is an important part of your overall health management. Your primary care provider can help coordinate your care and address any concerns that may arise.

4.Insurance Updates: If you plan to make any changes to your insurance, it's important to contact our office first. Speak with CINA before finalizing any changes to ensure that we remain in-network for your continued care.

5.Paperwork and Surgery Clearances: Any paperwork that requires completion by our office typically takes 7-10 business days. Please plan accordingly, especially if you're seeking clearance for elective surgeries, as it may take up to 7 business days to complete the necessary processes.

6.Contactting the Office: If you have any questions or need assistance, our heart transplant office is available 24/7 at 314-454-7687. Be sure to reach out to the heart transplant office directly, as general cardiology may not be able to assist with your specific transplant-related needs.

These guidelines are critical to maintaining your health and ensuring that your heart transplant journey is successful. Any of the BJC Heart Transplant Coordinators are always available to help you navigate these steps, ensuring you stay on track with your care.

I had always known since I was a child that I would some day need a transplant due to my congenital heart defect, Transposition of the Great Blood Vessels. 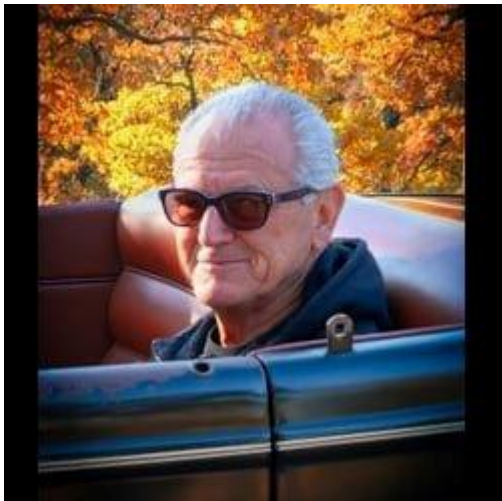

Rick was a devoted Christian and a sincere believer, actively involved in the First Baptist Church of St. Charles. A recipient of a heart transplant, he became a dedicated member of the Heart Transplant Association and an ambassador for Barnes Jewish Hospital St. Louis, using his journey to inspire and support others. Rick's passion for hot rods led him to attend numerous rod runs, but for him, the friendships he built through these events were just as important as the cars themselves. He never met a stranger and cherished his friends as much as his family, living life with joy and purpose. Rick was an incredible mentor and encourager, embodying what it means to be a man of God and leading by example in every aspect of his life. Married to his beloved Karen for nearly 53 years, he was a shining example of love, faith, and fulfillment. Rick was dearly loved and will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

About Bobby

Robert Thomas Christman III was born in St. Louis, MO on July 19, 1995 to Bob and Dawn Christman, and the oldest brother to Sean and Sydney. Bobby was a rough and tough kid from the beginning. He was extremely athletic performing well on the baseball field in elementary and middle school and in high school was a key tackler on the DeSmet High School Rugby team, as well as a state qualifying wrestler his senior year. After high school Bobby attended Southeast Missouri State and was a member of the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity. His charm and enthusiasm was infectious. His boyish laugh was unmistakable.

Being the oldest sibling, he had an innate quality of being a protector. Bobby dreamed of being a Marine. He planned to follow his dream of enlisting after college. To him the Marines symbolized all that Bobby was, tough, no fear and standing for what is right. All of these qualities stood out in Bobby’s final moments.

On Sunday, January 11, 2015, at the age of 19, Bobby was shot during an attempted carjacking in downtown St. Louis. He was protecting his younger brother and friend.

Bobby chose to be an organ donor upon getting his driver’s license. His decision has saved the lives of 5 others who received his heart, lungs, liver, pancreas and kidneys. Several others benefited from the donation of skin, bone and connective tissue.

2 scholarships have been created in Bobby’s memory. One scholarship is through Bobby’s fraternity, Sigma Phi Epsilon at Southeast Missouri State. The other scholarship is through DeSmet Jesuit High School where Bobby attended. There are fundraising events each year to benefit these scholarships and our fund.

Green lights in Dogtown were flipped on this week to commemorate the life-saving gift of a heart transplant and the Missouri husband whose life it saved after years of heart failure.

5 On Your Side's Annie Krall sat down with his wife Andrea Cunningham less than 72 hours after the man on the brink of death, Jim Cunningham, now has a new future.

On Tuesday, Jim drove almost four hours with Andrea from their home in Nixa to St. Louis hoping they'd get a very important call.

"It was raining that day," Andrea said. "Traffic was really bad. Everything I did, it was taking me 10x as long to do it. But it all led me to be there Tuesday evening whenever we received word that he had received a heart."

A retired UPS driver, Andrea said he'd been looking very ashen and gray in the days before.

Getting care from BJC Healthcare with [Dr. Amanda Verma](#), [Dr. Gregory Ewald](#) and [Dr. Justin Hartupee](#) and the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis [cardiovascular division](#) in the weeks leading up to the surgery. Hoping to improve her husband's heart failure that Andrea said started around 2016.

"How different would this conversation be if Jim hadn't gotten a transplant?" Krall asked.

"If we were not provided this opportunity, I truly believe he would not be here," Andrea said.

A life-saving gift thanks to the surgery early Thursday morning at BJC Healthcare with the help of cardiothoracic surgeons [Dr. Amit Pawale](#) and [Dr. Muhammad Masood](#) with Washington University Physicians.

The medical procedure was commemorated this week with the 'Light It Green' event. Seen as green lights outside Mid-America Transplant's [Family House](#) in Dogtown along with other homes across the country to mark Jim's milestone and honor the donor's heart that now beats in his chest.

"You know that somebody else is losing somebody," Andrea said. "I know that's hard. I pray for that family. I pray that they have peace and comfort but what they've done is that they've given my husband new life."

Kevin Lee is the CEO of [Mid-America Transplant](#) which houses hundreds of loved ones in St. Louis during recovery. Helping facilitate about [800 organ transplants](#) last year throughout Missouri, Southern Illinois and Northeast Arkansas.

"What's striking to me about Jim and Andrea's story is that once he was listed, he was able to receive that lifesaving heart transplant within 30 days," Lee said.

About 220 families have stayed at the Family House off of Lloyd Avenue since it's expansion in June of 2022. Allowing for private space rather than communal living for the Cunninghams expected to stay there for about a month as Jim recovers.

The family now looking toward how this new heart will help his new life.

"My daughter is dating somebody, and I know he's going to be there to walk her down the aisle," Andrea said about her daughter Ashlyn. "Just those life events that happen, he's going to be there now."

Andrea and Jim also have an 18-year-old son, Jack, who is a senior in high school in Nixa.

Mid-America Transplant says 17 Americans die every single day waiting for an organ transplant.

BJC Healthcare says more than 115,000 people in the U.S. are waiting for an organ. Emphasizing that one organ donor can save up to eight lives and improve the quality of life for up to 75 people.

'I've got a pulse!': Mere seconds from death of cardiac arrest, St. Louis patient beats the odds, makes miraculous recovery

T. LOUIS, Mo. (First Alert 4) - Mere seconds from death, a local man who nearly died of cardiac arrest is now vowing to pay it forward two years later.

Tony Meneses is a first-generation Filipino American who has spent the majority of his adult life living in St. Louis and working in IT before retiring.

He and his spouse of nearly five years, Paula Howard, call south St. Louis City home, but they've made a habit of traveling the world together. If he isn't traveling, you could probably find Meneses on a bike, taking part in rides and races across the area.

His healthy lifestyle made his ordeal even more unexpected. While at a party in 2022, he collapsed, eventually entering cardiac arrest.

"I felt fine, kind of walking around," Meneses said. "Then suddenly, I felt fatigued. I was going for my chair, and next thing I know, I had collapsed."

Meneses came seconds from death. Rushed to a nearby Emergency room at Mercy Hospital, doctors there administered CPR for more than an hour, trying to resuscitate him to no avail.

After several unsuccessful attempts to revive him, doctors told Howard she should say her final goodbyes. As she did, doctors began to unhook the various machines from Meneses, when something out of a movie happened.

"I touched his heart, and someone screamed, 'I've got a pulse! I've got a pulse!'" Howard remembers. "Everyone rushed back in and started working on him again, and they were able to stabilize him. He came back."

That fateful moment was just the start of Meneses's two-year-long recovery. After being transferred to Barnes Jewish Hospital for treatment, he spent the next few weeks in a medically induced coma. Doctors and his family were still unsure if he would ever be himself again.

"They'd ask him, 'Tony, you need to squeeze your wife's hand,' and there was nothing until the day he did," Howard said.

They determined that Meneses had gone into cardiogenic shock, a rare heart condition that results in death around 90% of the time. Dr. Joel Schilling, MD, PhD, was part of Meneses's care team at BJC.

"Many individuals who have a blocked artery in the location that he did, which supplies a major part of the heart... Many of these patients never even make it to the hospital," Dr. Schilling said. "[If] anything goes wrong in these steps, and he would have had irreversible damage to his brain."

His condition was brought on by Ischemic Cardiomyopathy, a more common form of heart disease that hinders the heart's ability to pump enough blood through the body.

Doctors in St. Louis found Meneses a heart transplant at Mayo Clinic in Minnesota. His family helped charter a private plane to ensure he could be transferred to Mayo safely.

After relearning how to walk, eat and drink, Meneses is now able to lead a normal life, nearly two years after the day he collapsed. He can only liken his ordeal to something out of a Hollywood film, thankful to the swarms of doctors across all three hospitals for saving him.

"It's like Saving Private Ryan," Meneses said. "They had teams lined up that would rotate through in the mornings, the evenings."

Meneses says that the effort to save him is priceless, something he appreciates even more because several of his family members spent time working in the medical field.

It's part of the reason that he chose to share this story now. He hopes that it inspires others to become doctors and nurses, to help others and save more lives. In the future, he hopes to speak to young people about the importance of doctors and maintaining a healthy heart.

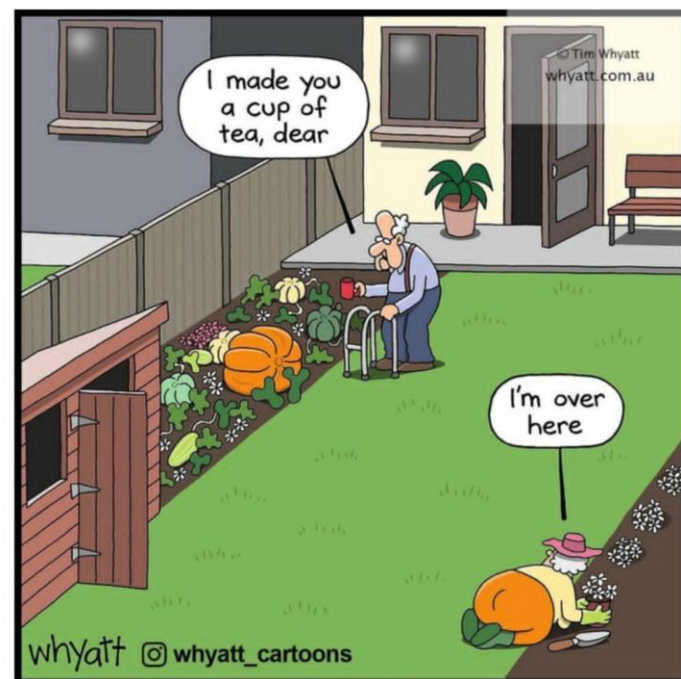
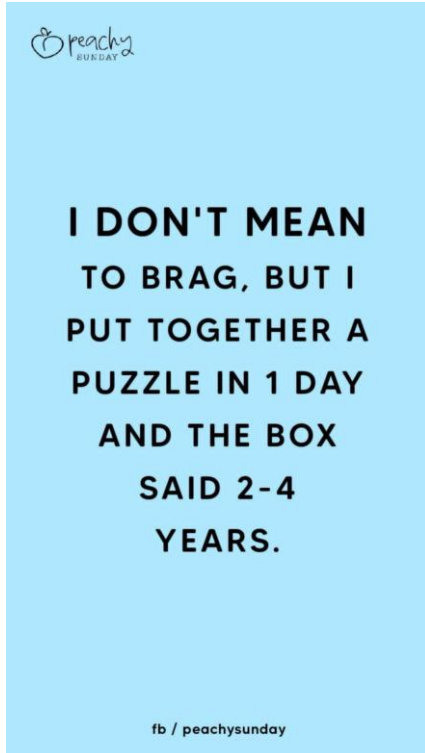
Dr. Schilling says two common ways to promote heart health are exercising and eating healthy. But he adds that much like in Meneses's case, severe symptoms can present themselves suddenly.

He says if you begin to feel several symptoms like chest pain, fatigue, nausea, or extreme shortness of breath, to get to a doctor's office or, in a severe case, an emergency room as soon as possible.

Meneses and Howard plan to get back to their normal traveling habits while enjoying time with their siblings and children.
