Declared as the southern gateway to the Flinders Ranges, the charming town of Crystal Brook effortlessly blends the beauty of a peaceful, natural setting with strong community spirit and commercial enterprise. Nestled at the heart of South Australia's sheep and wheat country, it sits 197kms north of the capital, Adelaide and is regarded as a picturesque location. Today, 1,537 residents call it home (abs.gov.au), making it the second largest town after the city of Port Pirie in the Southern Flinders Ranges area.

Named after the spring-fed creek next to which it was founded, the historic character of Crystal Brook is still everpresent. Shady peppercorn trees grace the main thoroughfare, Bowman Street, mixing modern low-set shopfronts with traditional architecture. There's even a self-guided 2.8km walking tour through the streets of Crystal Brook showcasing some of town's unique and historic homes.

Crystal Brook serves as a major junction on the Sydney–Perth and the Adelaide–Darwin railway lines, both sharing the same 530km (approx.) of track between Crystal Brook and Tarcoola. A triangular junction here joins Tarcoola, Adelaide and Sydney and sees regular trains each day in all directions. The town also lies on the famed Heysen Trail, a 1,200km walking trail stretching from Cape Jervis to Parachilna Gorge.

Bowman Park is a favourite place for locals and visitors, with this nature preserve boasting an abundance of wildlife and shady camping spots right next to the Crystal Brook Creek. The park contains history dating back to the 1800s, including the original homestead owned Bowman Brothers, who purchased the Crystal Brook run back in 1857. Even today, you'll still find some of the same families running farms in this rural region, some 150 years on. It predominantly produces grain and has ideal conditions to grow good quality wheat, barley and legume crops.

Families are also well catered to with sporting facilities such as hockey, tennis, croquet, golf, lawn bowls, netball, basketball, swimming, gymnasium exercise, junior soccer, horse riding, motor-cross, football and cricket. Plenty of parks also frequent the area, including a playground, with shaded BBQ and picnic areas opposite Adelaide Square.
