Peterborough Information

Located 246 km north of Adelaide, Peterborough is a historic railway town in the mid-north of South Australia and nestled at the southern edge of the Flinders Ranges. Once a hub for mighty locomotives, it was hugely important as a railway link between the mines at Broken Hill and the iron and steel processing at Port Pirie. At its height, over one

hundred trains a day were passing through the town, and while today it's no longer a giant of the rail industry, it has pivoted into the 21st century with the arrival of Australian defence firm, Nova Systems, into the region.

In 2022 Nova Systems officially launched Space Precinct - a new ground station facility sprawled across a 21 hectare Peterborough site. It hosts world-leading technology connecting satellites to Earth and supports the state's plan to grow its presence in the \$500 billion-a-year global space sector. The Space Precinct site supports the Australian Space Agency, and Nova recently signed a new agreement with European space company Leaf Space which has just installed an additional terminal at the site.

Even with its technological advances, Peterborough still retains its quaint country charm. A population of 1,428 (2021 census) call it home, which plays host to one of the largest town halls in South Australia. It stretches along the main street and dominates the streetscape. In fact, many heritage-listed sites are found here, as is one of the nation's finest traditional experiences, Steamtown. A prime tourist attraction, the Heritage Rail Centre has original railway workshops and tools, the impressive half-circle Roundhouse which was built in 1925-1926, the unique triple gauge turntable (reputedly the only one in the world) and a former weighbridge. Peterborough also pays homage to "Bob the Railway Dog" with a sculpture of this internationally famous four-legged local, who spent his life traversing Sydney, Melbourne, Oodnadatta, Broken Hill, Mt Gambier and more by train.

Locals also love Victoria Park on Queen Street - a pleasant place for a leisurely stroll or picnic – and the town includes a preschool, a catholic primary school, a state primary school and a state high school. Peterborough Community Preschool is currently the only option for long day care, before and after school care.
