



MESSAGE FROM THE President



I have always needed to *own* the big decisions in my life and I have always wanted to make the *right* decision and to have the support and affirmation of my family. As a boy, it was my mother and father I wanted to please. By the time I was 14 I also wanted to please my Father in Heaven. (We, He and I, had been in close communication around my bedtime every night for many years.)

I had seen others pushed into the aisle during the invitation hymn and still others harangued in a way that simply would have held no sway over me; indeed, it would have slowed my response to the Gospel. And, so, I sat alone most Sunday mornings hearing the sermon but thinking about making my *own* decision and making it the *right* one.

Our minister, John Crowder, was my father's best friend and, so, I trusted him, but I trusted Him most of all.

Brother Crowder, as I called him, announced he was leaving for a new pulpit one Sunday morning and I knew I wanted him to baptize me before his departure. We had just opened a new church building in Lawrence, Kansas, the one still standing and serving today, and I missed being the first to be baptized in that new worship facility by just one precious soul who preceded me. I was proudly the second to obey the Gospel before my mother and father, my Heavenly Father, and my home congregation, on April 17, 1966.

What a joy it is to remember this life-altering event as we gather in Malibu, April 29 – May 2, for the 71st annual Pepperdine Bible Lectures. My prayer is that as we gather for renewal, we will be stirred to new service of Christ by focusing on the theme, "Enter the Water, Come to the Table."

We look forward to welcoming you to campus as we remember the wonderful things God has done in and through us, along with the amazing things He is continuing to do.

MESSAGE FROM Mike Cope



Neurologist Oliver Sacks describes a memorable patient of his named Jimmy G, whom he calls “the lost mariner.” Sacks discovered that Jimmy—described in a transfer note as “helpless, demented, confused, and disoriented” at the age of 49—had no memory of the previous 30 years.

When they began visiting in 1975, Jimmy was convinced it was 1945. He described his old Navy days in the present tense. Though he had perfect memory from before 1945, amnesia had wiped out everything since.

Sacks wondered, “Is this man’s essence gone? Does he even have a soul?” But then he observed Jimmy during a chapel communion service.

“I was moved, profoundly moved and impressed,” Sacks writes, “because I saw here an intensity and steadiness of attention and concentration that I had never seen before in him or conceived him capable of. I watched him kneel and take the Sacrament on his tongue, and could not doubt the fullness and totality of Communion. . . . He was wholly held, absorbed, by a feeling. There was no forgetting . . . nor did it seem possible or imaginable that there should be; for he was no longer at the mercy of a faulty and fallible mechanism.”

Sacks goes on to claim that Jimmy G, the lost mariner, found himself in communion.

As we gather on the beautiful Pepperdine campus in Malibu on April 29 through May 2, we’re hoping to find ourselves again through exploring the theme “Enter the Water, Come to the Table.”

Much of Christianity’s discussion of baptism and communion focuses on their essentiality. But what happens when we shift the discussion a bit: not just on their essentiality but also on their essence? We may find that these simple acts of immersion and communion can guide us to explore more deeply the themes of gospel, discipleship, community, mission, and eschatology.

We look forward to welcoming you to campus as we worship, study, fellowship—and remember, through the guidance of baptism and communion, the goodness of God through Jesus Christ by the power of the Spirit.



Born and raised in Rockford, Illinois, Ortberg graduated from Wheaton College and holds a master of divinity and doctoral degree in clinical psychology from Fuller Theological Seminary. Prior to joining MPPC, he served as teaching pastor at Willow Creek Community Church in Chicago, Illinois. He is a member of the board of trustees at Fuller Seminary, serves on the board for the Dallas Willard Center for Spiritual Formation, and is a former board member of Christianity Today International.

The Covenant in All Its Complex Diversity

We will reflect on the ancient uses of the covenantal traditions and the implications for our own practices of faith.

Walter Brueggemann is William Marcellus McPheeters professor Emeritus of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary. A past president of the Society of Biblical Literature, he has recently written *Disruptive Grace* (Fortress Press), *David and His Theologian* (Wipf and Stock), and *The Practice of Prophetic Imagination* (Fortress Press).

Before Brueggemann's first lecture, Rick Marrs, Professor of Old Testament and dean of Seaver College at Pepperdine, will teach a class on the influence he (Brueggemann) has had on Churches of Christ.

In this class, Ian Cron and Josh Graves will explore the theological and cultural meaning of the lyrics and music of U2—arguably the most influential international band since The Beatles. What is it about U2 that has captured the hearts and imaginations of millions of listeners worldwide? What can local churches and nonprofits glean from U2's impact and cultural influence that goes to the deeper nature of Jesus and Jesus' kingdom?

Cron is an author, speaker, Episcopal priest, psychotherapist, and retreat guide.

To introduce others to St. Francis of Assisi, he authored *Chasing Francis: A Pilgrim's Tale*. Thomas Nelson released Cron's spiritual memoir *Jesus, My Father, the CIA, and Me: A Memoir ... of Sorts* in June 2011. *Publishers Weekly* described the book as, "Simultaneously redemptive and consoling with bright moments of humor ... a story chock-full of sacredness and hope." The book was chosen as a featured title in the prestigious Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers program.

Cron divides his time between living in Tennessee and Vermont with his wife and three children.

WHAT IS THE THEME THIS YEAR?

Just like the adults, we will be discussing communion and baptism. We will tell the story of Passover to help put the Last Supper in context, as well as many other great biblical stories that fit our theme.

WHAT WILL MY CHILDREN BE DOING?

Toddlers and infants will have a time of singing and a short Bible story, while the others will be divided up into age groups. We will have a group worship time and then rotate through four different rooms, learning Bible stories, acting them out, doing crafts, and playing games.

WHO TAKES CARE OF MY CHILDREN?

Over 40 Pepperdine students staff the Making Waves program. Many have extensive experience creating programs at their home congregations or working with children on mission trips around the world. Every student worker goes through University-sponsored training that certifies them to work with children.

WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD WEAR?

Play clothes! Because our games often take place outside, we recommend providing a jacket or sweatshirt for cooler temperatures.

WHAT ABOUT AFTERNOON NAPS?

Naps are a part of every young child's routine. Sometimes even the older children nap because we play so hard during

Making Waves! We have a fully equipped, fully staffed nap room. We recommend bringing a blanket or favorite stuffed animal that might help your child sleep, if you anticipate your child needing to nap. Extra diapers for those little nappers would be helpful too.

WILL SNACKS BE SERVED? WHAT IF MY CHILD HAS ALLERGIES?

We do serve a light snack each day, keeping in mind those children with nut allergies. If your child has allergies, please let us know in the online registration. If you choose to pack a snack for your child, please avoid anything with nuts. For children who are bottle-fed, we encourage you to provide formula for at least two bottles.

I'VE NOTICED THAT THERE IS NO PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN IN THE MORNING. WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH MY CHILDREN?

One of the best things about the Pepperdine Bible Lectures is that you can experience it as a family. With over 36 morning sessions each day, there are a variety of classes that may interest your children. Some families may also choose to enjoy the morning leisurely. For the morning keynote, we will have a packet of activities that coincide with each lecture for children to work on. 

A Fresh Encounter

WELCOME FROM THE CHURCH RELATIONS TEAM

I recently offered to meet a friend at the Heroes Garden to begin a tour of the Drescher Graduate Campus. Even though this visitor had been to campus many times, she had never been to the garden that honors Pepperdine alumnus Thomas Burnett (MBA '95), who perished on United Flight 93, as well as the hundreds of first responders who gave their lives in New York City on September 11, 2001.

As she walked the garden path, she paused at the cauldron of troubled water at the top of the steps, and then crossed the stream that runs the length of the path before it resolves, peacefully, in the infinity pool. The touching tribute and the beauty of the serene setting moved her. It provided her with a fresh perspective of Pepperdine.

There are many such hidden places on our Malibu campus worth visiting. The Biggers Family Courtyard with scripture engraved in stones and a fountain trickling over smooth rocks provides a quiet spot to pray and meditate. The patio adjacent to the community tennis courts at the north corner of Alumni Park is a lovely, private setting for a group picnic under a shady trellis next to rolling hills and stunning ocean views. My personal favorite spot is the point just outside the front of Stauffer Chapel. It seems that you can see eternity from there.

There are dozens of these hideaways around campus. Do you have a favorite? I would encourage you to explore them using the virtual tour on your 2014 Pepperdine Bible Lectures app. I predict that you will find a special place that you never knew was tucked away somewhere on the side of these hills.

Pepperdine's fourth president, William S. Banowsky, in his 1970 speech that dedicated the Malibu campus identified

what he called "a spirit of place" that hovers over the 830 acres of this Pepperdine property. The ancient land with vistas of an unending sea provides a perfect setting for a fresh encounter with Aristotle, Plato, and Christ.

As our guest, these special places are yours to enjoy. It is our sincere desire that this "spirit of place" will provide a setting for you to encounter the living Word of God in a new way. Set aside time to quietly meditate and pray. Walk with God along rugged trails all around the campus. Stumble upon the dwelling places of ancient people. Breathe deeply. The sea air is fresh. The environment is filled with life and meaning.

Admittedly, nothing can really eclipse the richness of worship in Firestone Fieldhouse or the great lectures and Bible studies in Elkins auditorium; but do not ignore the quiet invitation of special places on campus and the environment that surrounds it. They, too, are encouraging you to have a fresh encounter with God.



"We follow Jesus into the water to become God-followers..."



EXCERPT FROM John Mark Hicks' book, *ENTER THE WATER, COME TO THE TABLE*

At one level, Jesus owned the divine mission as his own in this act of surrender. Immersed by John, he surrendered his life to the purposes of God. He pursued those purposes in his ministry. Luke, in fact, correlates the baptism of Jesus and the ministry of Jesus—Jesus is baptized and then he begins his ministry (Luke 3:21-23). At his baptism, Jesus becomes—in a significant sense—a disciple of God as he embraced the mission and ministry of the kingdom. He became a God-follower with a public ministry in the kingdom of God.

At another level, Jesus encountered God in this baptismal moment. Not only was he anointed with power by the Holy Spirit that enabled his ministry, he heard the voice of God. What he heard is important—he is a beloved son in whom God delights. This is a profound declaration of deep joy and love rooted in Psalm 2:7 and Isaiah 42:1 (also 62:4). It is a celebratory word from God as God rejoices over Jesus. Moreover, it is the inauguration of a renewed community—restored Israel. Jesus is the first member, the first fruit of that community.

This is our baptism, too. When we are baptized, we own the divine mission as well. We surrender our will to the divine agenda, to the kingdom of God. We embody the prayer, "Your kingdom come; your will be done." We follow Jesus into the water to become God-followers, disciples of Jesus himself. Baptism is a discipleship marker—both in the life of Jesus and in our lives.

When we are baptized, we also encounter God. The words Jesus heard are not simply for him. They are about us as well. Arising out of the water we have become part of the community that God names "Hepzibah"—the one in whom God delights (Isaiah 62:4). That is our name. We, too, are beloved children of God. The divine blessing voiced at the Jordan River is heard at every baptism.

MEETING GOD ON Zuma Beach

On September 23, 2012, Pepperdine first-year undergrad Zachary Wilson braced himself as he entered the surf near Zuma Beach, lifeguard tower number four. The tide was high and the water that swirled about him was ice cold. Hundreds stood by and watched as the salty seawater swallowed him. It was the last time they would see the Zach Wilson they had once known. Zach had gone to the water's edge that early Sunday morning to die—to put to death a young man who had only known how to live for himself.

"I had thought knowledge of Jesus," Zach says. "I didn't have heart knowledge." Earlier that semester, Zach and 12 other students took a first-year seminar class on spiritual formation taught by the preaching minister of the University Church of Christ, Rich Little. "Rich began to show us who Jesus was. He showed us that Jesus was real and was relevant to every aspect of our lives."

Having grown up in a Christian home in Scottsdale, Arizona, attending Scottsdale Bible Church, Zach knew the books of the Bible, the great Old Testament heroes, the account of Mary and Joseph and baby Jesus. But they were just stories—no more or less real than Tom Sawyer, Abraham Lincoln, or Babe Ruth. "I had no need to believe them in my heart," Zach says.

During each class session, Rich taught his students to consider fresh ways to live intentionally for Christ. During his sermons on Sunday, he began teaching about baptism and the importance of publicly declaring your faith as a disciple. For the first time, Zach was listening with

his head and his heart. As the Jesus of the Bible story became the living Word of God, Zach knew something must change. He knew that to live as a disciple, the young man he had once been, must be put to death.

On that fall Sunday morning, with his mother Renee, his father Andy, sister Abigail, and brother Joshua, and several hundred members of the University Church of Christ standing on the shoreline, Zach entered the waters off Pacific Coast Highway and gave his life to Christ. "The ocean is a special place to be baptized," Zach says.

"The surf is like God's power. I felt like I was bathed in the living water of God."

Today, Zach, now a sophomore, says that he has been completely transformed and that his thoughts are fixed on God. He is active in home Bible study on campus and he shares his faith with any who will listen. He left the Zach he once was on the shores of Zuma Beach and emerged from the waters a young man with a new identity. He says, "For the first time, I know who I am."
