SHOW CONDITIONS & RULES

- Mail entries and stall request forms at least two weeks prior to show to avoid a \$25 Post Entry Fee and/or late Stall Charge!
- Classes with matching letters (a,b,c, etc) run concurrent. Riders entering more than one concurrent class will only pay one Judges Fee (the highest applicable fee).
- RHANW retains 50% of entry fees. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with the RHANW & NRHA rules. See below for RHANW Rules and Class Descriptions.
- There will not be any payout in AQHA classes.
- **Stalls Reservations:** Trainers responsible for group stall reservations. \$150 for Circuit includes 3 bags shavings Tues-Sat night). Stalls reserved for one or two nights are \$50 per night and include 2 bags shavings. Additional shavings are \$9/bag. Haul-ins are \$15 per day/per horse.
- **RV/camping:** \$30/night for water/electricity. \$35/night for water/electricity/sewer. Due to limited RV hookups at this show RV spaces will be reserved and assigned on a "1st reserved" basis as entries are received.
- Host Hotel: Timber Lodge Inn, 301 W 1st, Cle Elum. Call 800 584-1133 and say you are with Reining Horse Association to get a 10% discount on room rate. This is a busy time of year, so be aware that they may already be booked full.

WSHP Release of Liability for Property Damage, Personal Injury or Death

I choose to participate voluntarily in Equine Activities, as that term is defined in RCW 4.24.530(2), at the Washington State Horse Park ("WSHP"). The WSHP is an equine activity sponsor, as that term is defined in RCW 4.24.530(3). I am fully aware of and acknowledge that Equine Activities involve inherent dangerous risk of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering or death ("Harm").

I agree to release WSHP Authority and the individual WSHP Board members and the WSHP Foundation and the individual WSHP Foundation Board Members, their agents, assigns, employees and contractors and members, the City of Cle Elum and Suncadia, LLC (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Released Parties") from all claims for money damages or loss for any Harm to me, my injury or death, the injury or death of my child(ren) named below ("Child") or my horse or for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm, directly or indirectly, resulted from the negligence of the Released Parties.

I agree to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my child or my horse.

I agree to indemnify the Released Parties and to hold the Released Parties harmless from all claims, causes of action and money damages resulting from Harm to me, my Child, or my horse while I am participating in Equine Activities at the WSHP facility.

Under Washington State law, except as provided in RCW 4.24.540(2), an equine activity sponsor or an equine professional shall not be liable for an injury or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity, and, except as provided in subsection (s) of this section, no participant nor participant's representative may maintain an action against or recover from an equine activity sponsor or an equine professional for an injury to or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity.

I have read and understand the Rules and Regulations of WSHP that are posted on the WSHP property. I understand these rules and regulations of WSHP will be changed from time to time and I agree to abide by the changed rules. I represent that I and/or my child have the requisite training, coaching and ability to participate safely in the activities we chose to pursue at WSHP.

<u>Release of Photographic and Video Images</u> I hereby give permission to WSHP and those acting with its authority the unrestricted right and permission to use, publish and republish any photographic or video images of me and/or my horse for promotional and marketing purposes of the Horse Park. I also permit the use of any printed material in connection therewith and relinquish any right to review or restrict it's use or publication.

I have read and understand these Releases; my signature below signifies my acceptance of their terms and conditions. I agree these Releases shall remain in full force and effect until they are specifically revoked by me in writing or superseded by new releases issued by the Horse Park and signed by me.

<u>ATTACHMENT B</u> Washington State Horse Park <u>RULES AND REGULATIONS</u>

The Washington State Horse Park Authority intends to operate the Horse Park in a safe, sustainable manner; to provide a healthy environment for recreation and enjoyment, and to preserve the natural beauty of the setting to the fullest extent possible. To support these objectives, the following rules are applicable to all visitors.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Obey all permanent and temporary signs posted by the Horse Park.
- 2. Visitors bringing a horse onto the property are to <u>immediately register</u> at the Office or self sign-in kiosk in order to <u>sign a liability release</u> and <u>pay any relevant fees</u>, or to check in with the Event Organizer, prior to unloading.
- 3. All wheels on gravel no parking or driving in woodlands or on grass.
- 4. Stay on designated pathways and trails and in all other ways avoid disturbing the undeveloped ground and vegetation that comprise the Park's fragile woodland ecosystem. Do not forge new paths.
- 5. No motorized vehicles or horse-drawn carriages on trails, including dirt roads, except as authorized by Park management.
- 6. No cutting or removal of branches, trees or other natural vegetation, except as specifically authorized by Park management.
- 7. Leave the property as you found it for the next visitor pick up manure and scattered hay, strip your stall, fix pawing and other impacts, and dispose of trash.
- 8. Personal safety
 - a. Any person riding or driving a horse should wear protective head gear. Any adult choosing not to do so, or parent of a child who allows their child to ride/drive without protective head gear, assumes all risks which may result from their decision, including injury or death.
 - b. Anyone jumping obstacles is <u>required</u> to be with a trainer registered with Park management, or be registered with an event, and must wear protective headgear, shoes with a heel; those jumping outside of an arena must wear a safety vest.
 - c. Although not required, it's a good idea to take a powered-up cell phone with you on the trails.
- 9. Horse handling:
 - a. Horses may not be tied to trailers or other structures unattended.
 - b. All horses on the property overnight must be kept in a stall (one horse per stall) with bedding and water.
 - c. Do not tie horses to trees.
 - d. Horses are not allowed in woodland RV hook-up camping spots #2-14, due to damage, manure and other impacts that degrade the setting for visitors
 - e. Lunge in designated areas by the stalls; no lunging in arenas without prior approval of Park management.
- 10. Serious fire hazards!!
 - a. <u>Only propane-fueled fire is allowed</u>, and only on gravel or bare dirt surfaces at least 8 feet from the nearest vegetation in RV and parking areas. No charcoal, wood or other cinder- producing fire materials allowed at any time.
 - b. No smoking near vegetation, stalls, arenas, or in any building. All smoking material is to be fully extinguished and disposed in nonflammable containers, not in trash cans.
- 11. Dogs:
 - a. <u>All dogs must be on a leash while on Park property</u>; please pick up after your dog and keep it under control.
 - b. <u>All dogs must be on leash while on the trails</u> dogs can scare horses, injure or kill wildlife, and be injured or killed by predators.

- 12. Do not dig into or otherwise materially alter arena footing.
- 13. Any information or material affixed to the stalls must be removable and secured in such a way as to not cause damage. EVENT SPONSOR is responsible for removal of all materials at the completion of the show/event.

HEALTH AND SAFETY RULES

- 1. <u>Call 911 immediately in the event of an emergency</u>. Other emergency contact information may be posted at/near the Office. The Horse Park should be made aware of any accident or injury requiring emergency medical treatment as soon as practical after qualified medical assistance is contacted.
- 2. Emergency Medical Technician(s) are required to be on site for certain organized activities, as agreed in advance with the EVENT SPONSOR.
- 3. If hazardous conditions occur, (e.g., lightning, heavy rain, ice, heavy wind, etc.) Horse Park has the right to postpone or cancel any activity or event.
- 4. Horse Park reserves the right to require immediate removal of a horse to an isolated location at owner's expense if a horse is deemed by a licensed veterinarian to have, or be a carrier of, an infectious disease.
- 5. Horse Park, in cooperation with EVENT SPONSOR, may remove dangerous, disruptive or unlawful persons from Horse Park property; request the assistance of law enforcement officers in removal of such persons or in resolving other problematic situations, and request the assistance of emergency medical personnel, veterinarians or law enforcement officers to address any issues that come to the attention of the Horse Park.

VEHICLES & PARKING RULES

- 1. <u>All vehicles</u> (including cars, trucks, trailers, vans, motor homes, RV's and golf carts) <u>must be parked in designated areas.</u>
- 2. Hook-ups for trailers/camper/ RV's include water and electrical, and in some cases sewer. Any vehicle parked in spaces supplied with these services is required to pay for a Hook-up space, whether plugged into utilities or not.
- 3. Only licensed persons may operate a motorized vehicle on Horse Park grounds.

EVENT SPONSOR shall take all steps that are reasonably necessary to enforce the above regulations.

The Horse Park will take whatever action is necessary to enforce these Rules and Regulations, which may include towing of offending vehicle(s), fines and/or restrictions on future use of the Horse Park.

The Washington State Equine Limitation of Liability Act, RCW4.24, applies to all horse-related activities associated with the Horse Park. Horses by their very nature present a risk of injury, harm or death. Riders represent that they are qualified to participate in the activities and at the levels they elect. All horses on the property participate entirely at the owner's and rider's risk. The owner/rider is personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves or their horse.

Ranch Riding Clinic by Debbie Cooper AQHA Senior Ranch Riding World Champion

Ranch Riding is designed to showcase the movement, attitude and versatility of the working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse riding outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. Primary considerations in evaluating a Ranch Riding Horse include the responsiveness of the horse while performing the required maneuvers, the horse's quality of movement and ability to move at a forward, working speed while under the control of the rider.

Debbie Cooper is an AQHA, NRHA, NRCHA and USEF judge. Debbie was the 2016 AQHA Senior Ranch Riding World Champion and is a multiple Arizona Sun Circuit Ranch Riding Champion.

Debbie's clinics are designed with "success in the show pen" as a goal. The clinic will begin with a discussion of ranch riding from a judge's perspective including an overview of Ranch Riding, avoiding penalties, offensive vs defensive strategies when showing. NRHA NW Regional Affiliate Championships

- All three RHANW shows will count toward qualifying for the Northwest NRHA Affiliate Regional Championships that will be held in October at the Low Roller Reining Classic in Nampa, Idaho.
- To qualify for the Northwest NRHA Affiliate Regional Championships both the Rider and Owner must be current RHANW members.
- The date of your RHANW membership is very important. If a member is not current until after a circuit show, points from that show will not count towards that members points for NRHA qualification standings.
- Horse must have an NRHA competition license.
- There is no minimum or maximum shows that a horse and rider must attend.
- The top 15 horse and rider combinations from most NRHA classes will qualify for the NW Affiliate Regional Championships Finals, where they compete for the right to go on to the NRHA North American Championships.
- The top 10 horse and rider combinations, plus ties, from the Affiliate Regional Championships will advance to the NRHA North American Affiliate Championships.
- A rider may qualify in only one region and for only one affiliate. You must complete and send in your NRHA Affiliate Designation Form to NRHA by August 1st! Visit <u>NRHA.com</u> for more info.



RHANW Arena Etiquette



General:

- If there are more than 10 riders in the arena during warm-up time, circling will be on the hour and fencing on the half hour i.e. circling at 6:00 and fencing at 6:30. Stay with the flow of traffic.
- Be aware of everything that is happening around you. Look up, ride defensively and be courteous to other riders. Do not sit in the flow of traffic or ride side by side while talking to another rider.
- If you need to talk on the phone or text either leave the arena or stand away from moving horses.
- When the tractor/drag enters the arena, all riding should stop and riders should exit arena.
- While the show is running, only horses that are getting ready to show should be in the covered warm area immediately adjacent to the main arena.
- The wash rack in the main arena may not be used when horses are showing.
- Alcohol is not allowed in the warmup or main arenas.
- Dogs are not allowed in the warmup arenas. If you choose to take your dog into bleachers by the main arena, it must be on a leash and under your control at all times.
- Please control your children and dogs so as not to spook horses that are in the arena showing.
- If there appears to be a potentially dangerous situation in a warmup arena or anywhere on the show grounds please contact show management or any RHANW board member for assistance.
- Please be advised that the RHANW has a zero tolerance policy for unsportsmanlike conduct or animal abuse. Report any instances to show management immediately.

Circling and spins:

- When the riders are circling, the side of the arena nearest the in gate is for left circles and the far end is for right circles. Circlers have the right of way. Do not ride against the flow of traffic.
- Slower horses (walk/trot) should stay on the inside of the circles and be in single file.
- Look around before you stop and back your horse. Be sure that no one is immediately following you.
- Work on spins in the center of circles that are being run and not in the path of the circle.

Fencing:

- When the riders are fencing, please be careful and watch for riders running up and down the arena.
- If you are fencing and there is a chance that someone may be in your way or not paying attention, give them a "HEADS UP" to avoid an accident.
- Please do not sit in the middle of the arena when people are fencing.
