# Mail entries and stall request forms by July 6<sup>th</sup> to avoid a \$25 Post Entry Fee and/or late Stall Charge!

- Classes with matching letters (a,b,c, etc) run concurrent. Riders entering more than one concurrent class will only pay one Judges Fee (the highest applicable fee).
- RHANW retains 50% of entry fees. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with the RHANW & NRHA rules. See below for RHANW Rules and Class Descriptions.
- There will not be any payout in AQHA classes.
- Dogs must be on leash and under control of owner at all times.
- No horses allowed in campgrounds, landscaped areas or on grass areas

**Stall Reservations:** Trainers are responsible for group stall reservations. \$180 for Circuit includes 3 bags shavings (11 cu ft bales) Tues-Sat night. Stalls reserved for one or two nights are \$75 per night and include 1 bag shavings. Additional shavings are \$10/bag or you may bring your own. Haul-ins are \$15 per day/per horse.

- ❖ If you are planning to arrive on Tuesday, July 20<sup>th</sup>, please do not arrive prior to 3:00pm.
- ❖ You can help reduce club expenses by stripping your stall before you leave. Your support is appreciated!

**RV/camping:** \$35/night for water/electricity. \$40/night for water/electricity/sewer. \$15/night for dry camp. RV spaces will be reserved and assigned on a "1st reserved" basis as entries are received.

**❖** Due to limited RV space please consider dry camping if you have a generator.

RHANW is offering qualifying classes for The Run for a Million (TRFAM). The qualifying classes will run concurrent with NRHA Rookie Level 2 and NRHA Ancillary NonPro divisions. Exhibitors are required to enter into the corresponding NRHA event divisions to be eligible for The Run For A Million (TRFAM) Qualifier. The top five placings, and ties in each slate, qualify to compete at The Run For A Million, August 17 – 21, 2021, Las Vegas, NV. Qualification is based on the rider, not the horse, only one time qualification required. There is a separate entry fee for exhibitors for each qualifying division, per slate; \$200 for Rookie and \$200 for NonPro. There is no prize money offered and these qualifiers are not NRHA approved but do fall under the same rules and regulations. The entry fees have been established to ensure those who are committed to wanting to take part in TRFAM Championships have the opportunity to do so without the possibility of being knocked out of a top five spot by another exhibitor who does not wish to or cannot participate at TRFAM.



# GENERAL SHOW, CLASS & YEAR END AWARD RULES

### **SHOW RULES:**

- All three RHANW shows will count as qualifying shows for the NRHA Affiliate Finals.
- The draw for the first class of the day will be drawn no later than 9:00 pm the night before. All other classes will be drawn at least one hour before class begins.
- If an entry is made after the draw is posted, it is the decision of the show management as to whether that entry runs first or last. It must be consistent for all entries in that class (except in the case with an exhibitor with multiple horses).
- In the event of a tie in a class refer to NRHA Handbook.
- Class Awards will be given through third place in all classes. It is the owners/riders responsibility to pick up awards at the awards table.
- Owners/riders do not have to be members of RHANW to show in RHANW Club Classes (see class rules below). However, membership is required to qualify for Year End Awards (see Year End Award Rules).
- For failure to pay all fees due or where an NSF check has been written refer to NRHA Handbook for actions. Outstanding
  funds must be paid within 15 days of written notice. If not paid the incident will be reported to the NRHA and further
  action may be taken.
- RHANW reserves the right to alter the show, the arena and schedules at any time as circumstances may dictate or as may
  be deemed appropriate. RHANW reserves the right to cancel any part of the event without notice at any time prior to the
  contest and without liability to show management. In the event of such cancellation, show fees paid in advance will be
  refunded.
- Contestants are expected to run the designated NRHA pattern number assigned to each class. As a courtesy to the judges, contestants intending to school their horses should make their intention to school obvious to the judge at the beginning of their run. Off-pattern schooling runs shall not exceed four minutes.

## YEAR END AWARDS RULES: (see the show class list for eligible Year End Award classes):

- Awards will be presented to the Year End Champion and Reserve Champion for each eligible class.
- Riders must be current RHANW members <u>prior</u> to the first RHANW qualifying show of the year for points to count toward Year End Awards. Owners are not required to be current RHANW members.
- Non Pro and Youth class points will be awarded to a "one horse-one rider" combination. Open and Age specific class points will be awarded to the horse.
- Points and money earned at all three RHANW shows accumulate for Year End Awards. The "one horse-one rider" combination or eligible horse must show in a majority (at least two of the shows), in a respective class, for the accumulated points to count at the end of the show season.
- Points will be calculated as follows:
  - O Qualified entries in a class include all competitors who mark a "0" score or better, however, "0" scores will not be awarded any points. Non-qualified entries are "scratches" or "disqualifications".
  - O Award calculation for 5 qualified entries is: 1<sup>st</sup>=5 points, 2<sup>nd</sup>=4 points, 3<sup>rd</sup>=3 points, 4<sup>th</sup>=2 points and 5<sup>th</sup>=1 point.
  - o In the case of a tie at an individual show, qualified entries will share the points of the placings. An example with 8 qualified entries and a 3-way tie for 4<sup>th</sup> placing is: 1<sup>st</sup>=8 points, 2<sup>nd</sup>=7 points, 3<sup>rd</sup>=6 points, 4<sup>th</sup>=4 points, 4<sup>th</sup>=4 points, 7<sup>th</sup>=2 points, 8<sup>th</sup>=1 point.
  - o In the case of a tie in the final year end points, the total money earned at the shows in that eligible class will be used to determine the winner of the award.
- Any points awarded for a show where an NSF check has been written, or all fees due are not paid, will automatically be forfeited.



# GENERAL SHOW, CLASS & YEAR END AWARD RULES

## **CLASS RULES:**

- Refer to NRHA Handbook for rules governing all NRHA approved classes. Handbook is available online at <a href="https://www.nrha1.com/handbook">www.nrha1.com/handbook</a>.
- Refer to AQHA Handbook for rules governing all Ranch Riding classes. <a href="www.aqha.com/membership/resources/rulebook">www.aqha.com/membership/resources/rulebook</a>.
- Lil Boots Reiner: Youth 11 & Under as of January 1 of current year. Youth do not have to own horse. Rider may show 1 or 2 handed in any legal bit and with standard reins or any type of closed rein. There will be no penalty for holding saddle with either hand. The same horse may be shown by two different youth riders in this class only. Parent or other adult to accompany child to and from gate with option to stay in arena to assist/help (leading is permitted). Helmets may be worn instead of cowboy hats and are suggested. No stallions may be ridden.
- Youth 13 & Under: Any rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse. No stallions may be ridden.
- Youth 14-18: Any rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse. No stallions may be ridden.
- Ladies and Gentlemen's Classes: Any rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- **Beginner Rider**: Non-Pro rider who as of January 1 of current year has not won more than \$350 in reining competition. Refer to NRHA Green Reiner rules. May use 1 or 2 hands at any time during the pattern with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- **Rookie Rider**: Non-Pro rider who as of January 1 of current year has not won more than \$500 NRHA lifetime earnings in all categories excluding 3, 7, 9 and 10 AND/OR has not earned more than 50 youth points in NRHA sanctioned competition. 1 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- **Limited Non-Pro:** Rider who as of January 1 of current year has not won more than \$2,500 NRHA lifetime earnings in all categories excluding 3, 7, 9 and 10. 1 handed with any legal bit. NRHA horse ownership rules apply.
- Non-Pro: 1 handed with any legal bit. NRHA horse ownership rules apply.
- **Green Reiner Horse Open:** Horse who as of January 1 of current year has not won more than \$250 in reining competition. Rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- **Junior Horse Class:** Horse 5 years old and younger. Rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit or in a bosal. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- **Senior Horse Class:** Horse 6 years old and older. Rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit or in a bosal. Rider does not have to own the horse.
- Never Won a Buckle: Non-Pro who has never won a buckle in reining competition. 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. NRHA horse ownership rules apply. Offered at June show only.
- **Freestyle**: Any rider may show 1 or 2 handed with any legal bit. Rider does not have to own the horse. Offered at June show only. Refer to NRHA Handbook for details on required maneuvers, scoring, and guidelines.
- **Futurity/Derby rules**: Futurity horses aged 3 or 4 may be shown 1 or 2 handed in any legal bit. Derby horses aged 4 to 7 may be shown either one handed in any approved bridle or two handed in a snaffle bit or a hackamore. Riders may not change hands or switch from one to two hands. Stallion Stakes Futurity classes are for eligible 3 or 4 year olds and will run concurrently with the other futurity classes. See eligibility rules at www.rhanw.com/stallion-auction



2021 Affiliate Regional Championships and Adequan® North American Affiliate Championships Qualification Criteria Announced

- ❖ The NRHA Board of Directors has announced the qualification criteria for the 2021 Adequan® NAAC. The rules for the current year are the same as in 2020 when the pandemic forced changes to accommodate both the riders and the local affiliates and Affiliate Regional Championships (ARC). The only addition is that riders must be an affiliate member to show at an ARC.
- ❖ Once again, anyone receiving a score higher than a zero at an ARC will be able to enter that class at the NAAC in Oklahoma City. There are no requirements to compete at an ARC other than the rider must be a member of an NRHA affiliate, which they are encouraged to join beforehand. The objective of the NRHA Board is to encourage people to attend the ARCs and support the affiliate program without limiting the number of horses that attend the Adequan® NAAC.
- \* Riders must designate the RHANW as their affiliate by August 1. The NRHA Affiliate Designation Form can be found at <a href="https://nrha.com/media/pdf/affiliate/designation.pdf">https://nrha.com/media/pdf/affiliate/designation.pdf</a>
- Horses must have an NRHA competition license to accumulate points

- Attend an Affiliate Regional Championship and score higher than a zero
- Enter the NAAC and enjoy competing at the largest reining event in the country!





# RHANW ARENA ETIQUETTE

### General:

- If there are more than 10 riders in the arena during warm-up time, circling will be on the hour and fencing on the half hour i.e. circling at 6:00 and fencing at 6:30. Stay with the flow of traffic.
- Be aware of everything that is happening around you. Look up, ride defensively and be courteous to other riders. Do not sit in the flow of traffic or ride side by side while talking to another rider.
- If you need to talk on the phone or text either leave the arena or stand away from moving horses.
- When the tractor/drag enters the arena, all riding should stop and riders should exit arena.
- Alcohol is not allowed in the warmup or main arenas.
- Dogs must be on a leash AND under your control at all times.
- Please control your children and dogs so as not to spook horses that are in the arena showing.
- If there appears to be a potentially dangerous situation in a warmup arena or anywhere on the show grounds please contact show management or any RHANW board member for assistance.
- Please be advised that the RHANW has a zero tolerance policy for unsportsmanlike conduct or animal abuse. Report any instances to show management immediately.


# Circling and spins:

- When the riders are circling, the side of the arena nearest the in gate is for left circles and the far end is for right circles. Circlers have the right of way. Do not ride against the flow of traffic.
- Slower horses (walk/trot) should stay on the inside of the circles and be in single file.
- Look around before you stop and back your horse. Be sure that no one is immediately following you.
- Work on spins in the center of circles that are being run and not in the path of the circle.

### Fencing:

- When the riders are fencing, please be careful and watch for riders running up and down the arena.
- If you are fencing and there is a chance that someone may be in your way or not paying attention, give them a "HEADS UP" to avoid an accident.
- Please do not sit in the middle of the arena when people are fencing.

# Washington State Horse Park 2021 RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Washington State Horse Park Authority strives to operate the Horse Park in a safe, sustainable manner; to provide a healthy environment for recreation and enjoyment, and to preserve the natural beauty of the setting to the fullest extent possible.

# **GENERAL RULES**

- 1) Obey all permanent and temporary signs posted by the Horse Park.
- 2) Prior to unloading, visitors bringing a horse onto the property are to <u>immediately register</u> using the master registration form either at the Visitors Registration kiosk or on line at wahorsepark.org which includes signing the liability release and paying relevant fees.
- 3) Keep all vehicle wheels on gravel; do not park on grass or in woods.
- 4) Be aware that wildlife may be present in and around the Park: be prepared for sudden interactions, keep dogs on leash, carry your cell phone, etc.
- 5) <u>Dogs must be on leash and under control at all times</u> to protect people, horses and other animals; in addition, barking, aggression and destructive behavior of dogs is not allowed.
- 6) Serious fire hazards!!
  - a. <u>Only propane-fueled fires</u> are allowed at any time, and only on gravel or bare dirt surfaces at least 8 feet from the nearest vegetation in RV and parking areas. No charcoal, wood or other cinder- producing fire materials allowed at any time.
  - b. No smoking near vegetation of any kind, near stalls, arenas, or in any building. All smoking material is to be fully extinguished and disposed in nonflammable containers, not in trash cans.
- 7) Any person riding or driving a horse should <u>wear protective head gear</u>. Any adult choosing not to do so, or parent of a child who allows their child to ride/drive without protective head gear, assumes all risks which may result from their decision, including injury or death.
- 8) Anyone jumping obstacles is required to <u>wear protective headgear</u> and shoes with a heel; those jumping outside of an arena must wear a safety vest. Anyone jumping any man-made <u>cross-country obstacle must be supervised by a professional</u> trainer with proper insurance certificates (see cross country procedures at registration kiosk or on the Park's website).
- 9) Consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited while mounted, and no one <u>impaired by any substance</u> will be permitted to ride or be present around stabling, competition or recreational areas.
- 10) Do not alter arena footing or any property without express permission from Park management.

# HORSE HANDLING

- 11) No horses in RV spaces #2-15 or in wooded tent camping area
- 12) Horses may not be tied to trailers or other structures unattended.
- 13) All horses on the property overnight must be kept in a stall (one horse per stall) with bedding and water.
- 14) Do not tie horses to trees
- 15) No turn out in arenas
- 16) Lunge in designated areas by the stalls; no lunging in arenas without prior approval of Horse Park management.

# **TRAILS**

- 17) Stay on designated pathways and trails; do not forge new paths or disturb the undeveloped ground and vegetation that comprise the Horse Park's fragile woodland ecosystem.
- 18) No motorized vehicles or horse-drawn carriages on trails, including dirt roads, except as authorized by Park management.
- 19) Be aware that wildlife may be present in and around the Park: be prepared for sudden interactions, keep dogs on leash, carry your cell phone on trails, etc.
- 20) Although not required, it's a good idea to take a powered-up cell phone with you on the trails.

# **OTHER VEHICLE & PARKING RULES**

- 21) All vehicles (including cars, trucks, trailers, vans, motor homes, RVs and golf carts) must be parked in designated areas and not on or in vegetation.
- 22) Any vehicle parked in numbered RV spaces supplied with utility services is required to pay for a hook-up space, whether plugged into utilities or not
- 23) Only licensed persons may operate a motorized vehicle on Horse Park grounds.

# **COVID-19 PANDEMIC RULES**

- 24) All users of the Horse Park and its facilities understand and acknowledge being informed that during the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, the Horse Park will comply with all regulations imposed by the State of Washington Department of Health and/or the Kittitas County Department of Health. These regulations may require Horse Park users to refrain from certain activities within the Horse Park. Each user of the Horse Park facilities agrees to comply with such rules and regulations implemented to prevent the spread of COVID-19. If a user is not complying, he/she agrees to leave the Horse Park property at the request of the Horse Park.
- 25) All users of the Horse Park agree they will cease using its facilities and will leave the property if any of the following occur:
  - a. The user feels sick with fever, cough or difficulty breathing.
  - b. The user has been exposed to a person with a confirmed COVID-19 case; then, in that event, the Horse Park user will not return to the Horse Park or use its facilities until the user has self-isolated for a minimum of 14 days consistent with applicable health department guidelines.
  - c. The Kittitas County Public Health Department has required the Horse Park user to self-quarantine.
- 26) Each Horse Park user agrees to do the following while at the Horse Park and using its facilities:
  - a. To cover their mouth and nose with some type of mask, bandana or handkerchief when around others while at the Horse Park, except while mounted. (**To be reviewed prior to event for compliance with updated Department of Health regulations**)
  - b. Maintain at least a 6-foot distance from other people not in your immediate household.
  - c. Wash hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer after visits to high-traffic areas or upon leaving and returning to the Horse Park.
  - d. Not shake hands with anyone.
  - e. Not share with anyone tack or horse equipment without sanitizing.
  - f. Use their sleeve to cover their mouth/nose when coughing or sneezing.
- 27) All Horse Park users agree to leave the property upon any of the following occurring:
  - a. A user shows signs of COVID-19 (fever, cough, or trouble breathing).
  - b. An employee requests the user to leave the property because of a violation of these COVID-19 Pandemic Rules.

## OTHER HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUES

- 28) Call 911 immediately in the event of an emergency. Other emergency contact information may be posted at/near the Office.
- 29) The Horse Park must be made aware of any accident or injury requiring emergency medical treatment as soon as practical after qualified medical assistance is contacted.
- 30) Obey any directives pursuant to an Emergency Evacuation or Containment Plan, or Bio Security Plan, as directed by Park management and local officials.
- 31) The Horse Park reserves the right to establish areas where alcohol and other mind-altering substances may and may not be consumed, and the right to remove from the Horse Park any visitor if, in the sole judgment of the Horse Park, the individual is unable or unwilling to follow the rules and regulations established by the Horse Park and/or creates a disturbance or unsafe circumstances for themselves, other visitors and/or their horses.
- 32) If hazardous conditions occur, (e.g., lightning, heavy rain, ice, heavy wind, etc.) Horse Park has the right to postpone or cancel any activity or event.
- 33) Horse Park reserves the right to require immediate removal of a horse to an isolated location at owner's expense if a horse is deemed by a licensed veterinarian to have, or be a carrier of, an infectious disease.
- 34) Horse Park may remove dangerous, disruptive or unlawful persons from Horse Park property or vehicles improperly parked, request the assistance of law enforcement officers in removal of such persons or vehicles and to resolve other problematic situations, and request the assistance of emergency medical personnel, veterinarians or law enforcement officers to address any issues that come to the attention of the Horse Park

The Horse Park will take whatever action is necessary to enforce these Rules and Regulations, which may include towing of offending vehicle(s), fines and/or restrictions on future use of the Horse Park.

The Washington State Equine Limitation of Liability Act, RCW4.24, applies to all horse-related activities associated with the Horse Park. Horses by their very nature present a risk of injury, harm or death. Riders represent that they are qualified to participate in the activities and at the levels they elect. All horses on the property participate entirely at the owner's and rider's risk and are in their care and custody while at the Park, including transportation in case of an emergency. The owner/rider is personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves or their horse.

# WSHP Release of Liability for Property Damage, Personal Injury or Death

I choose to participate voluntarily in Equine Activities, as that term is defined in RCW 4.24.530(2), at the **Washington State Horse Park** ("WSHP"). The WSHP is an equine activity sponsor, as that term is defined in RCW 4.24.530(3). I am fully aware of and acknowledge that Equine Activities involve inherent dangerous risk of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering or death ("Harm").

I agree to release WSHP Authority and the individual WSHP Board members and the WSHP Foundation and the individual WSHP Foundation Board Members, their agents, assigns, employees and contractors and members, the City of Cle Elum and Suncadia, LLC (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Released Parties") from all claims for money damages or loss for any Harm to me, my injury or death, the injury or death of my child(ren) named below ("Child") or my horse or for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm, directly or indirectly, resulted from the negligence of the Released Parties.

I agree to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my child or my horse.

I agree to indemnify the Released Parties and to hold the Released Parties harmless from all claims, causes of action and money damages resulting from Harm to me, my Child, or my horse while I am participating in Equine Activities at the WSHP facility.

Under Washington State law, except as provided in RCW 4.24.540(2), an equine activity sponsor or an equine professional shall not be liable for an injury or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity, and, except as provided in subsection (s) of this section, no participant nor participant's representative may maintain an action against or recover from an equine activity sponsor or an equine professional for an injury to or the death of a participant engaged in an equine activity.

I have read and understand the Rules and Regulations of WSHP that are posted on the WSHP property. I understand these rules and regulations of WSHP will be changed from time to time and I agree to abide by the changed rules. I represent that I and/or my child have the requisite training, coaching and ability to participate safely in the activities we chose to pursue at WSHP.

# Release of Photographic and Video Images

I hereby give permission to WSHP and those acting with its authority the unrestricted right and permission to use, publish and republish any photographic or video images of me and/or my horse for promotional and marketing purposes of the Horse Park. I also permit the use of any printed material in connection therewith and relinquish any right to review or restrict it's use or publication.

I have read and understand these Releases; my signature below signifies my acceptance of their terms and conditions. I agree these Releases shall remain in full force and effect until they are specifically revoked by me in writing or superseded by new releases issued by the Horse Park and signed by me. An electronic signature will have the same force and effect as a handwritten signature.
