- 1. What is the essential missionary task?
 - a. "If missions is everything, then missions is nothing"
 - b. Acts 1:8 "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- 2. Who are the nations?
 - a. Factors to Consider
 - Different definitions of people groups (geo-political nations, cultural blocs, ethnolinguistic peoples, sociopeoples, unimax peoples)
 - Globalization
 - Urbanization
 - b. For evangelical purposes, a people group is the largest group within which the gospel can spread as a church planting movement without encountering barriers of understanding or acceptance
- 3. What is a testimony?
 - a. Viable: growing on its own
 - b. Indigenous: not seen as foreign
 - c. Church Planting Movement (CPM): a fellowship of believers that continues to reproduce itself
 - d. E-Scale/P-Scale
 - They measure the same thing, just from 2 different perspectives
 - It is much easier for the Gospel to spread within a people group than it is to "jump" from one people group to another
 - There's an important distinction between initial breakthrough and ongoing spread
 - e. Evangelism: working within peoples with the same or very similar culture as your own where a church movement already exists
 - f. Regular Mission: working within peoples of different cultures where a church movement already exists
 - g. Frontier Mission: working within people groups of different cultures where a church movement does not yet exist
- 4. What is a UPG? A people group having less than 2% of its population evangelical Christian.
- 5. State of the World
 - a. Where are we now? (Most stats from Serving with Eyes Wide Open by David Livermore)
 - b. World C (Christian)
 - 2.2 billion people, 33.0% of the world's population
 - 72% of missionaries go here, \$39B or 87% of missions funding goes here

- c. World B (Reached, non-believers)
 - 2.6 billion people, 38.2% of the world's population
 - 25% of missionaries go here, \$5.4B or 12% of missions funding goes here
- d. World A (Unreached)
 - 2.0 billion people, 29.3% of the world's population
 - Less than 3% of missionaries go here, \$450M or less than 1% of missions funding goes here

 - a. The same way Jesus did...John 17:4

 - b. Will you be the stone? Or will you use anything and everything God has blessed you with to cast out as many stones as possible?
