We know that events are gearing up for the winter season and Yorkton has the amenities to host events of all sizes. When it comes to hosting an event, whether it's a business meeting, a major convention, wedding, or sporting event, Yorkton has the facilities.

"That's one of the great things about a city like Yorkton. It's small enough anyone coming into an event can find their way around easily, but we are large enough to have a full range of quality services," said Tourism Yorkton Executive Director Randy Goulden.

Goulden said it starts with accommodations and food. "Whether you need a room for a night, or fine hotels and motels," she said. "And our restaurants range from, providing burgers on the go as you travel, to those offering fine dining. There are of course private areas in some of the restaurants for small meetings as well."

When it comes to larger gatherings, that perfect wedding, or fraternal convention, Yorkton has the facilities for that too. The Painted Hand Casino, SIGN on Broadway, St. Mary's Cultural Centre, Godfrey Dean Cultural Centre, Land Titles Building and the City's own Gallagher Centre all have spaces to accommodate gatherings from just a few intimate friends, to a high level business gathering, to provincial conventions.

"We're fortunate in Yorkton to have such a range of facilities," said Goulden. "It has allowed the city to be the site of events from Pinty's Grand Slam Curling and Sunflower Craft Show & Sale, the annual SUN convention and the Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation convention."

Yorkton Lions Festival of Lights

Legacy Co-op WONDERS OF WINTER (a Yorkton Lions project) will return for a second Yuletide Season, and it promises some changes organizers say patrons will very much enjoy.

"We're so excited it's unbelievable," said Don Reed spokesperson for the Yorkton Lions Club, organizers of the now annual event. "After the first year we've learned mega stuff."

And the first year education of taking on such a major project will mean a number of improvements promised Reed.

For those unfamiliar with Wonders of Winter we can go back to an explanation of what the Lions were creating in year one.

"Imagine a chilly December evening in Yorkton, where the Yorkton City Campground transforms into a magical, twinkling wonderland. As families drive through the enchanting route,



they're greeted by whimsical light displays, each sparking joy and holiday cheer. This is not just a vision, but a viable project awaiting our initiative - The Yorkton Lions Festival of Lights. Modelled after the highly successful Enchanted Forest in Saskatoon, our event aims not only to instill a sense of community and joy but also to contribute significantly to local charitable causes."

Reed said the initial year saw an investment near \$250,000, but more is coming.

"Now it's just a matter of growing it," he said.

Some things will remain the same though, starting with Legacy Co-op being on-board with naming rights.

And after appearing before Yorkton Council earlier this year the Lions have a five-year lease to use the city campgrounds, providing a long-term home for the festive lights tour.

"So we can say it's full steam ahead," offered Reed.

Reed said there will be more of everything essentially, with added lights and displays, a number of those will be animated (through light controllers), adding to the displays in a major way

For example, there will be an animatronic dog sled team, a hockey game with movement, a snowman sliding down a hill, and the SIGA / Painted Hand Casino display will be enhancing with a moving eagle.

The opportunities to take in the displays are also being extended, opening Nov. 28, and extending until the final day Jan. 5. Reed said the extension adds two weekends for people to enjoy the displays.

Viewers will also be able to make the loop more than once as long as they don't leave the campgrounds, so if you want another look, around you may go, explained Reed.

And you will make the tour at a lower ticket price too. This year it will be \$20 per vehicle at



the gate, \$15 if you prepurchase at a Legacy Co-op location – \$5 lower than in 2024.

The Holiday Season is something special and to take in a light display is something most people like to do, the Wonders of Winter is something to mark on the calendar for the upcoming season.

The drive-thru light festival offers an accessible and delightful experience for families and individuals. It's an occasion for us to foster community spirit and provide a slice of enchantment during the winter season.

It is an idea Reed said has found a lot support and interest already, and he believes Wonders of Winter is going to be a fantastic attraction for Yorkton for years to come.


Summer Fun

Adaptive Technology Services

This program is dedicated to using technology to create opportunities and increase independence for individuals experiencing disability. If an individual can control one muscle function - like blinking their eye, turning their head or controlling their breath – we can apply switches to that movement to increase their freedom, choice and safety. Environmental controls, communication devices and computers can be operated with the push of a switch. That means that the use of alternative access through switches can enable someone with a physical disability to use a hands-free phone, operate appliances and remote controls, access a computer or use an augmentative communication device. Individualized services including assessments, installation and training can open the door to a new world of possibilities for people with disabilities.

Snowarama registrants raise a minimum of \$150 in pledges to participate and will enjoy over 100km of beautifully groomed and marked snowmobile trails, complimentary meals, fuel, Snowarama swag, and a ticket to the Awards Banquet! There are also chances to win some fantastic prizes! The weekend kicks off at SaskAbilities in Yorkton on Friday, March 6, with registration and a Beer & Wing Night. Come back Saturday morning for a delicious breakfast, then hit the trails for a great day of snowmobiling. 

Stretching along the east shore of York Lake, the park features courses from 18-hole golf course; a four-diamond slowpitch complex including two lighted fields, where slowpitch is played every day

of the week; the Yorkton Canoe and Kayak Club facilities; the Saskatchewan Wildlife Trap and Skeet Club where shoots are held every Tuesday during the summer; and Kin Point, which includes barbecue and picnic sites, a playground, swimming and shower facilities, a canteen, horseshoe pits and walking trails. The park has a campground for tenting and trailers, offering all the amenities for travellers. The lake is ideal for boating and sailing, and has boat launch facilities. 




